## SCHEDULE OF NOTES

- 1. This form is lodged as an original only and must be typed or completed in ink or biro. Alterations to information entered on the form should be crossed out (nor erased or obliterated by painting over) and initialled by the parties.
- 2. It is used for noting vesting pursuant to an Act including an Act of the Commonwealth. The imprint of the Commissioner of Territory Revenue must be shown.
- 3. For court orders other than a vesting order use Form 89.
- 4. If the Certificate as to Title (if issued) is readily available it should be produced.
- 5. Insert description of Land including Volume and Folio references.
- 6. Name and address. Include postal address for the service of notices. If there is more than one owner additional addresses may be specified. In that case the form should be adapted so that it is clear to whom each address relates.
- 7. Insert details of the vesting or grant. Where the vesting occurs pursuant to the court order, show date and number of the order or attach a sealed copy of the order.
- 8. Persons who may witness this document are a Commissioner for Oaths, a member of the Legislative Assembly, a legal practitioner within the meaning of the Legal Profession Act 2006, a person holding office under the Supreme Court Act 1979, the Justices of the Peace Act 1991, the Local Court Act 2015 or the Registration Act 1927, a member of the Police Force, a person licensed as a conveyancing agent or real estate agent under the Agents Licensing Act 1979, a Notary Public and any other person approved by the Registrar-General.

A witness to an instrument executed by an individual must first:

- take reasonable steps to ensure that the individual is the person entitled to sign the instrument;
- have the individual execute the document in the presence of the witness;
- not be a party to the instrument; and
- if witnessing more than one signature, clearly state that he/she has witnessed more than one signature. (ie I have witnessed the two signatures appearing above).

After signing, witnesses must legibly write, type or stamp their names and contact address or telephone number below their signature.

For a corporation, an instrument must be executed in a way permitted by law or sealed with the corporation's seal in accordance with the *Law of Property Act 2000*, Section 48.

For witnessing of instruments executed outside the Northern Territory refer to Schedule 1 of the Land Title Act 2000 and the Registrar-General's Direction.
