Sharing Books is Beginning Literacy

Kids enjoy learning about words and pictures when you share a book.

- Sit with kids and look at a simple picture book every day. Kids learn that books are fun.
- Hold kids close while looking at books. It helps kids enjoy reading and makes them feel safe and happy.
- Point to the words and pictures in books as you read. Kids learn that words always carry the same message.
- Show kids how to hold books and turn the pages. Learning how books work is part of learning to read.



Words are All Around

Looking at words helps kids learn that symbols can carry a message.

- Point to road signs in the community.
 Talk to kids about what they tell us.
- Talk about logos and words on T-shirts.
- Look at the words on food packets with your kids. Tell kids what they say.
- Show kids your name on the letters you get in the mail.



Songs and Rhymes

Songs and rhymes help kids to practice sounds, learn language and have fun.

- Sing songs in your language. Kids learn new words and practice sounds when they sing.
- Sing action songs to help kids learn to think, speak, listen and do.
- Singing helps kids learn to hear rhyming words that sound the same.
- Sing about every day things to well known tunes.



Watching and Listening

Watching and listening helps children to develop language.

- Talk with kids about what you are doing.
- Look at babies when you talk. They are learning about how to make sounds.
- Use actions to help kids understand language.
- Show kids you are listening when they talk.
 Repeat the same words back.



Same and Different

Kids learn words to describe their world.

- Help kids learn words to describe things.
 "These trees are all tall."
- Talk about things that are the same and different. "Look at the seedpods. Some are thick and some are thin."
- Collect things with kids. Sort them into piles.
- Talk with kids about what makes things the same or different.



Drawing and Scribbling

Drawing and scribbling helps kids learn that symbols and signs carry messages.

- Talk to kids about symbols and signs and what they mean.
- Give kids pencils, paper and time to scribble and draw.
- When kids do pretend writing, ask them what it says.
- Write your kid's name on their picture.



Pictures Tell Stories

Kids learn language when they talk about pictures.

- Look at newspapers, books and magazines with kids. Talk to your kids about the pictures.
- At the art centre, share the stories in the paintings.
- Paint with kids. Ask kids to tell you the stories in their paintings.
- Draw pictures in the sand and tell sand stories.



Telling Stories

Children learn language from stories.

- Talk to kids about the stories in paintings.
- Tell stories while you draw in the sand.
- Draw with kids. Talk about the pictures.
- Tell kids stories about when you were growing up.



Pretend Reading is Practice Reading

Children make up stories about pictures before they can read the words.

- Show kids how to use books.
- Point to the pictures in books. Ask, "What's happening here?"
- Listen to kids when they tell you stories about the pictures in books.
- Give kids picture books to pretend read.



Reading Gives Information

Kids learn that reading gives us information.

- Use hand signs with kids. They are learning about communicating with symbols.
- Look at magazines and newspapers with kids. Talk about the pictures and the written information.
- Read posters around the community with kids.
- Look at food labels in the shop. The label tells us what is inside.



Reading Helps Us

Kids learn that reading can tell us how to do things.

- Talk to kids about words that tell us what to do. Read labels on the medicine bottle. The words tell us how much medicine to take.
- Show kids the writing on the food packet. "The words tell us we need two cups of milk."
- Look at a map and show kids where they live and places they know.
- Show kids signs around the community.
 "The sign tells us the shop is open."



Computers for Reading

Kids learn that families find and read information from computers.

- Kids see you using computers. Kids learn that computers are used for reading and writing.
- Read email messages to kids. Kids learn that words carry a message.
- Show kids the email messages you write.
 Kids learn that computers can send messages to people in other places.
- Look up things on the internet that your child is interested in.



Mobile Phones

Kids learn that families use reading and writing to send and get messages on their phone.

- Let kids talk when family rings up. They learn about talking and listening.
- Read text messages to kids. Show them the text. They learn that letters carry messages.
- Talk about what you are doing on the phone. Kids like to have a turn.
- Show kids how you make letters and numbers on the screen.



Talking About TV

Talking with kids about what you watch on TV helps kids to think and learn.

- Watch TV or DVD's with kids. Talk about what is happening.
- Ask questions about what you see on TV.
- Sing and dance to the songs.
- Practice the same songs and dances when the TV is off.
