The collection methodology was created in accordance with Australian Bureau of Statistics data quality framework principles. Data in this publication are only reflective of those businesses reported on as operating in the town at the time of data collection (see Table 30 for list of businesses reported on).

To comply with privacy legislation or where appropriate, some data in this publication may have been adjusted and will not reflect the actual data reported by businesses. As a result of this, combined with certain data not being reported by some businesses, some components may not add to totals and changes over time may be partially reflective of business' change in propensity to report on certain data items rather than actual changes over time. Total figures have generally not been adjusted.

Caution is advised when interpreting the comparisons made to the earlier 2011 publication as the businesses identified and reported on and the corresponding jobs may differ between publications.

Notes for each table and chart are alphabetically ordered and listed at the end of the publication.

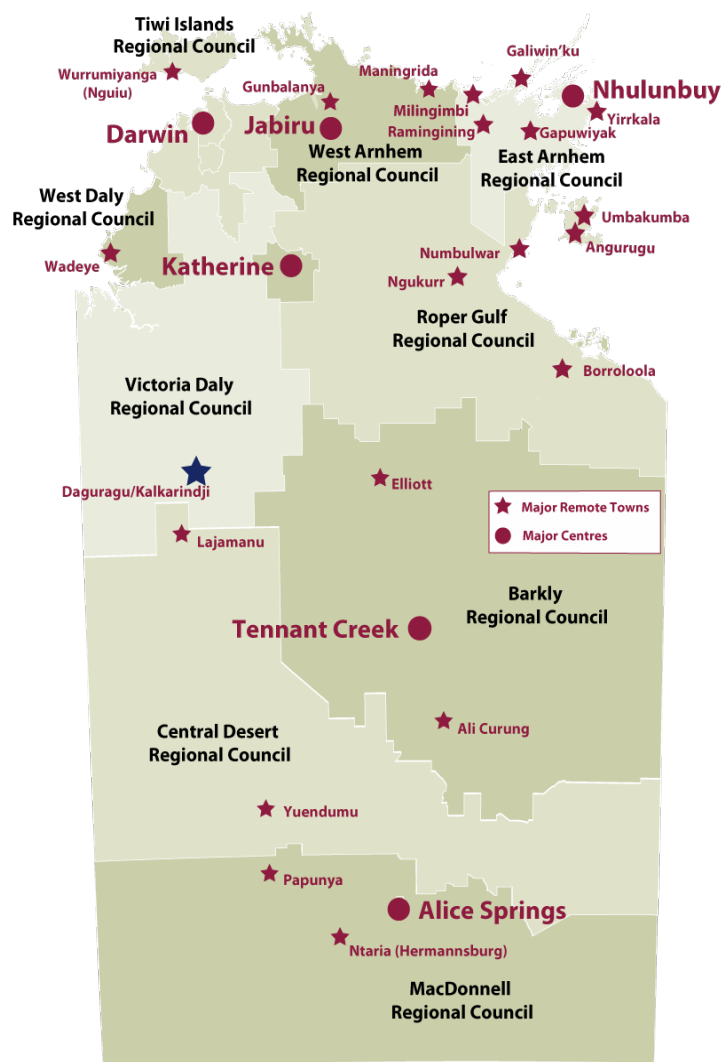
Daguragu/Kalkarindji

Daguragu/Kalkarindji is located approximately 460 kilometres south-west of Katherine.

The Northern Territory Government is working with Territorians, the Australian Government, regional councils, land councils, private businesses, Aboriginal organisations, not-for-profit organisations and industry groups to improve the standard of living in remote Territory communities.

This publication provides a snapshot of jobs and the characteristics of job holders in Daguragu/Kalkarindji as at June-July 2014. It contains information collected by the Northern Territory Department of Business from businesses operating within the town and is supplemented by other administrative data sets and information. This 2014 publication also compares and comments on variations that are evidenced between the 2014 and earlier 2011 collection periods.

The information collected and reported on represents a significant goodwill investment by those businesses that participated. Each business is listed at the end of this publication.



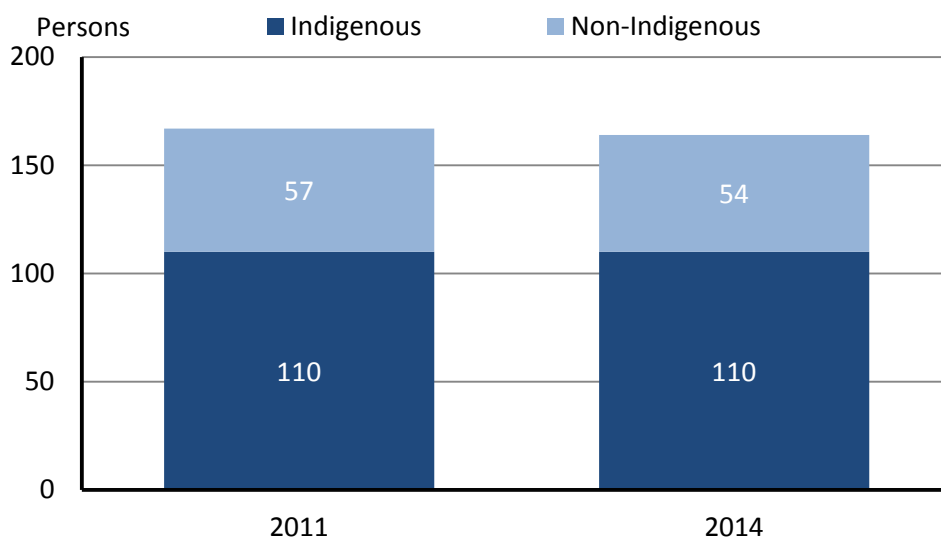
Publication Summary

At the time of collection in 2014 in Daguragu/Kalkarindji there were a total of 175 filled and vacant jobs, a decrease of 8 jobs overall from 2011. Filled jobs decreased by 3 to 164 jobs.

Of the 164 filled jobs there were:

- 110 jobs filled by Indigenous persons, unchanged from 2011, and 54 jobs filled by non-Indigenous persons, a decrease of 3 jobs from 2011

- 99 jobs in the public sector, a decrease of 18 jobs from 2011, and 65 jobs in the private sector, an increase of 15 jobs over the same period
- 124 permanent jobs, an increase of 22 jobs from 2011, and 40 temporary jobs, a decrease of 25 jobs from 2011
- 80 jobs filled by males, a decrease of 10 jobs from 2011, and 84 jobs filled by females, an increase of 7 jobs over the same period
- 13 jobs filled by persons aged 15-24 years, a decrease of 18 jobs from 2011, 101 jobs filled by persons aged 25-44 years, an increase of 39 jobs from 2011, and 50 jobs filled by persons aged 45+ years, a decrease of 24 jobs from 2011
- 43 jobs as Community and personal service workers, making it the largest occupation group in terms of filled jobs
- other significant occupation groups were:
 - Professionals with 39 filled jobs
 - Labourers with 29 filled jobs
- there were 11 vacancies, a decrease of 5 vacancies from 2011.

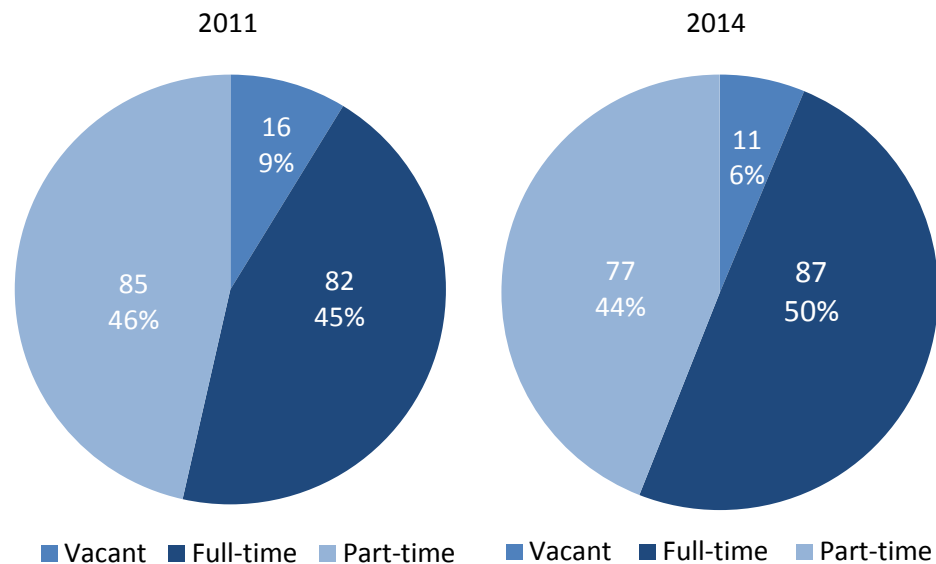

Chart 1: Count of vacant jobs and filled jobs by full-time/part-time status, 2011 and 2014 (a)(b)



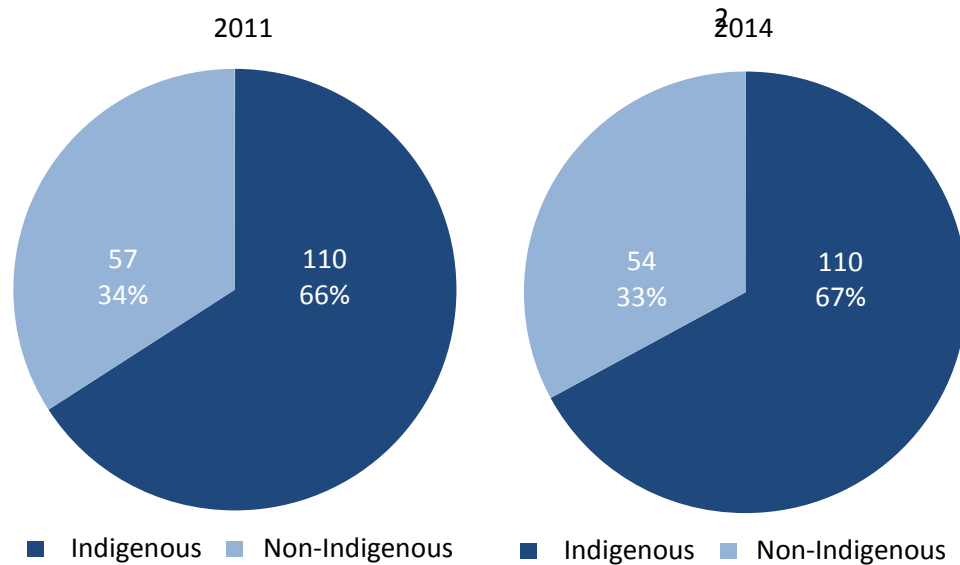

- there were a total of 164 filled jobs, a decrease of 3 jobs from 2011
- of the 164 filled jobs in 2014:
 - 87 were full-time jobs, an increase of 5 jobs from 2011
 - 77 were part-time jobs, a decrease of 8 jobs from 2011
- there were 11 job vacancies, a decrease of 5 vacancies from 2011.

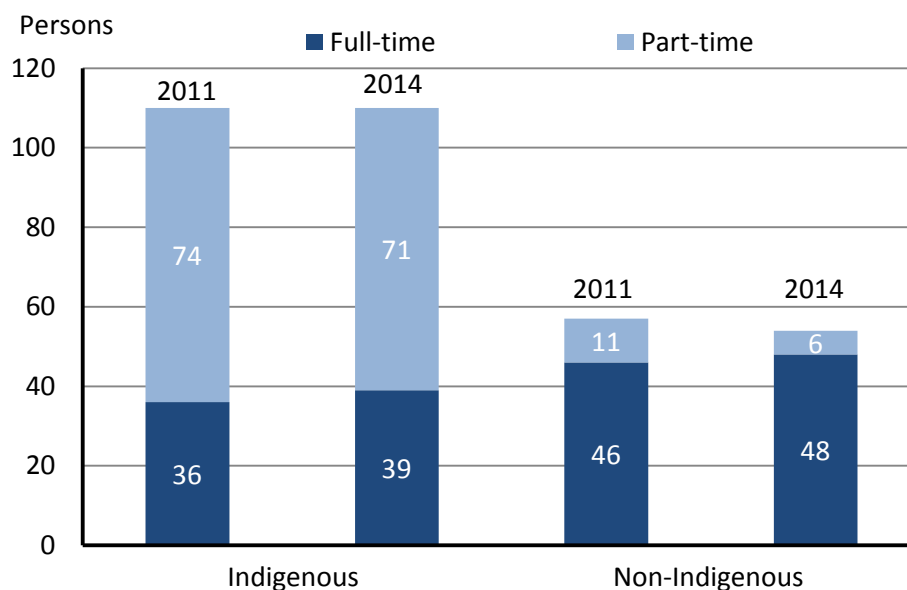
- of the 164 filled jobs:

 - 6 were part-time jobs filled by non-Indigenous persons, a decrease of 5 jobs from 2011.

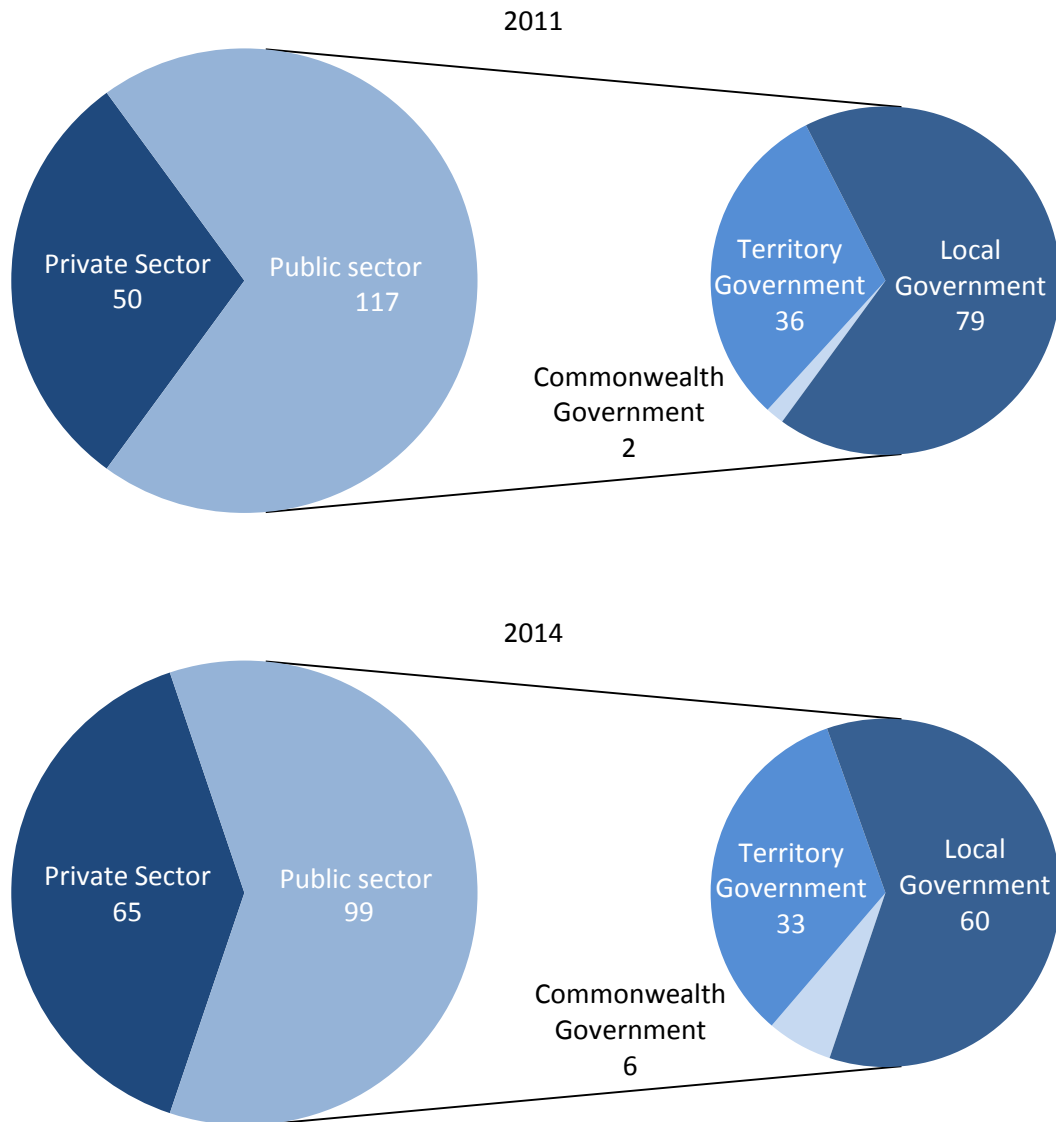

Chart 4: Count of filled jobs by sector of business, 2011 and 2014 (a)(d)

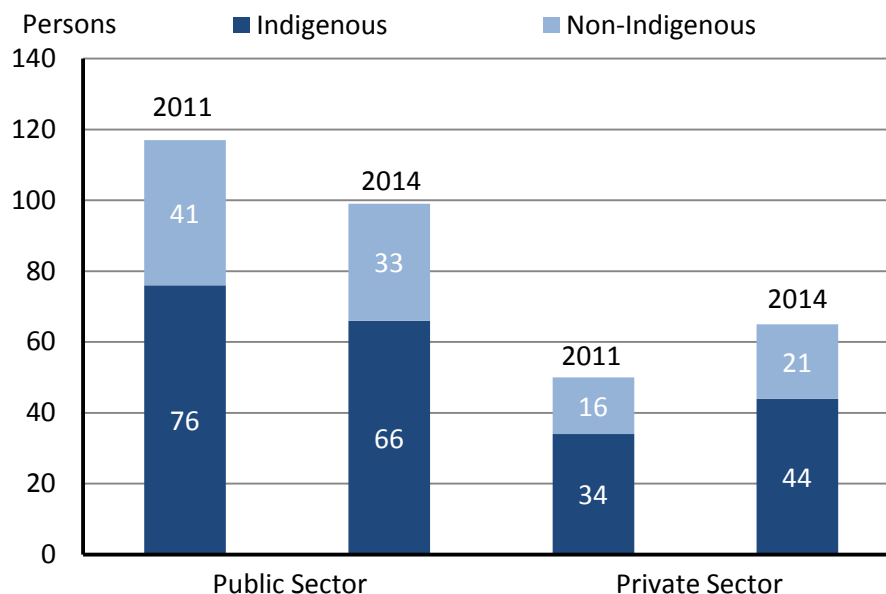

 - 33 jobs were in the Territory Government, a decrease of 3 jobs from 2011
 - 60 jobs were in the Local Government, a decrease of 19 jobs from 2011

Chart 5: Count of filled jobs by sector and Indigenous status of person in job, 2011 and 2014 (a)(c)(d)

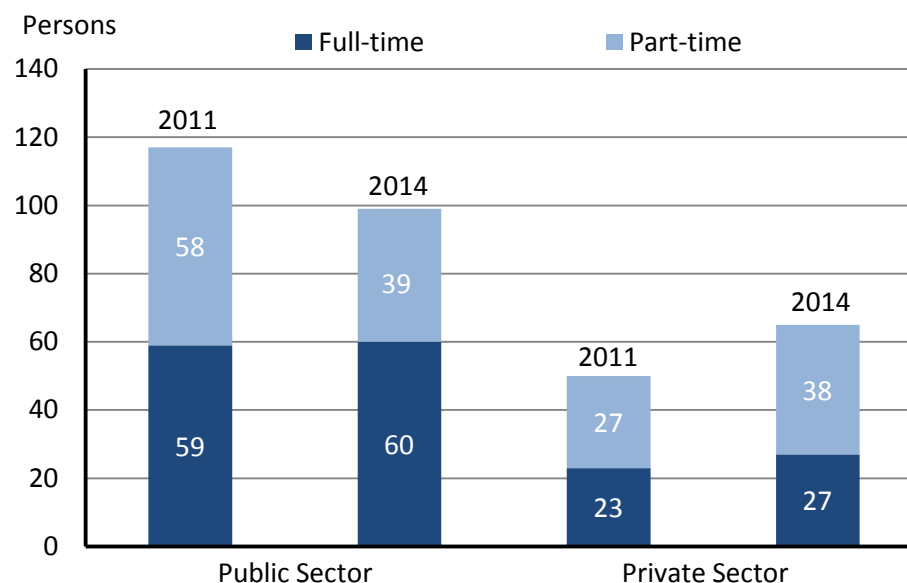

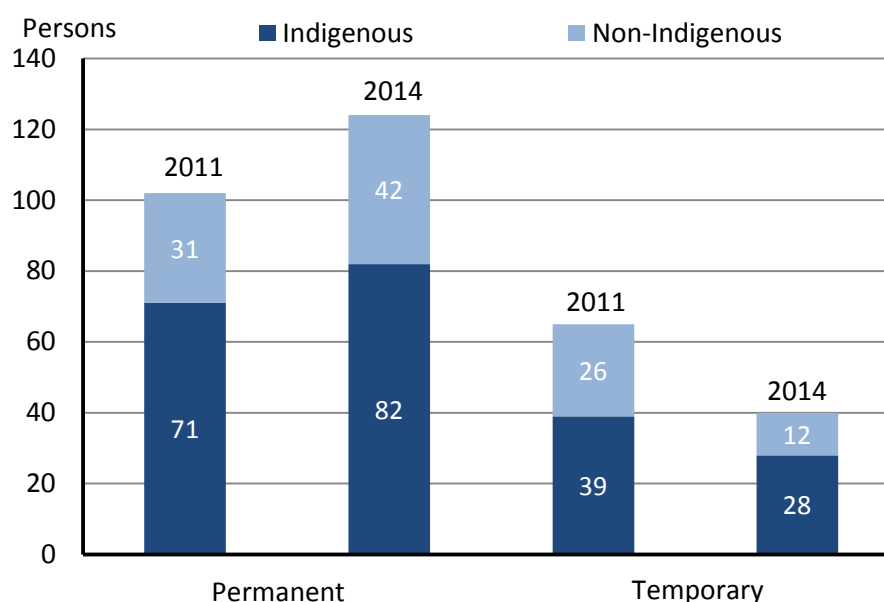

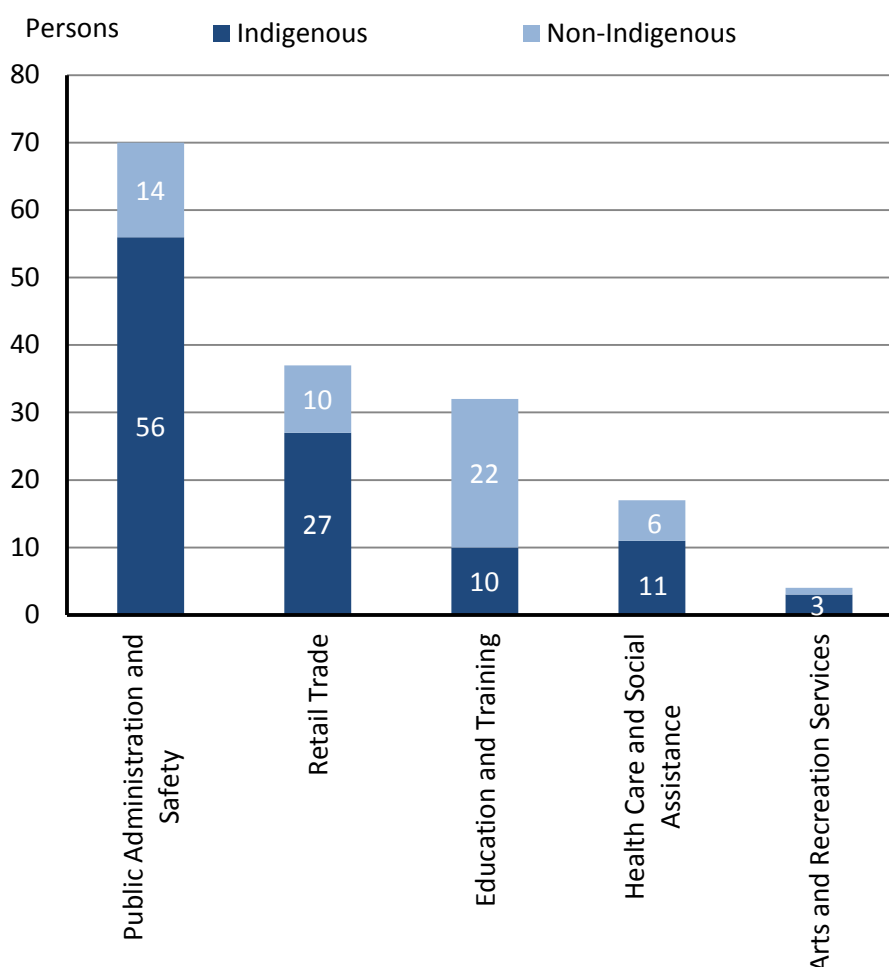
- the Public administration and safety industry was the largest industry employer, with 70 filled jobs or 42.7% of filled jobs, a decrease of 15 jobs from 2011
- other significant industry employers were:
 - Retail trade with 37 jobs (or 22.6% of filled jobs), an increase of 9 jobs from 2011
 - Education and training with 32 jobs (or 19.5% of filled jobs), a decrease of 4 jobs from 2011
 - Health care and social assistance with 17 jobs (or 10.4% of filled jobs), an increase of 8 jobs from 2011.

 - ◆ 2 jobs filled by non-Indigenous persons, a decrease of 1 job from 2011
 - 15 jobs in Education and training, a decrease of 10 jobs from 2011, including:
 - ◆ 5 jobs filled by Indigenous persons, a decrease of 4 jobs from 2011
 - ◆ 10 jobs filled by non-Indigenous persons, a decrease of 6 jobs from 2011
 - 3 jobs in Arts and recreation services, an increase of 3 jobs from 2011, all of which were filled by Indigenous persons.



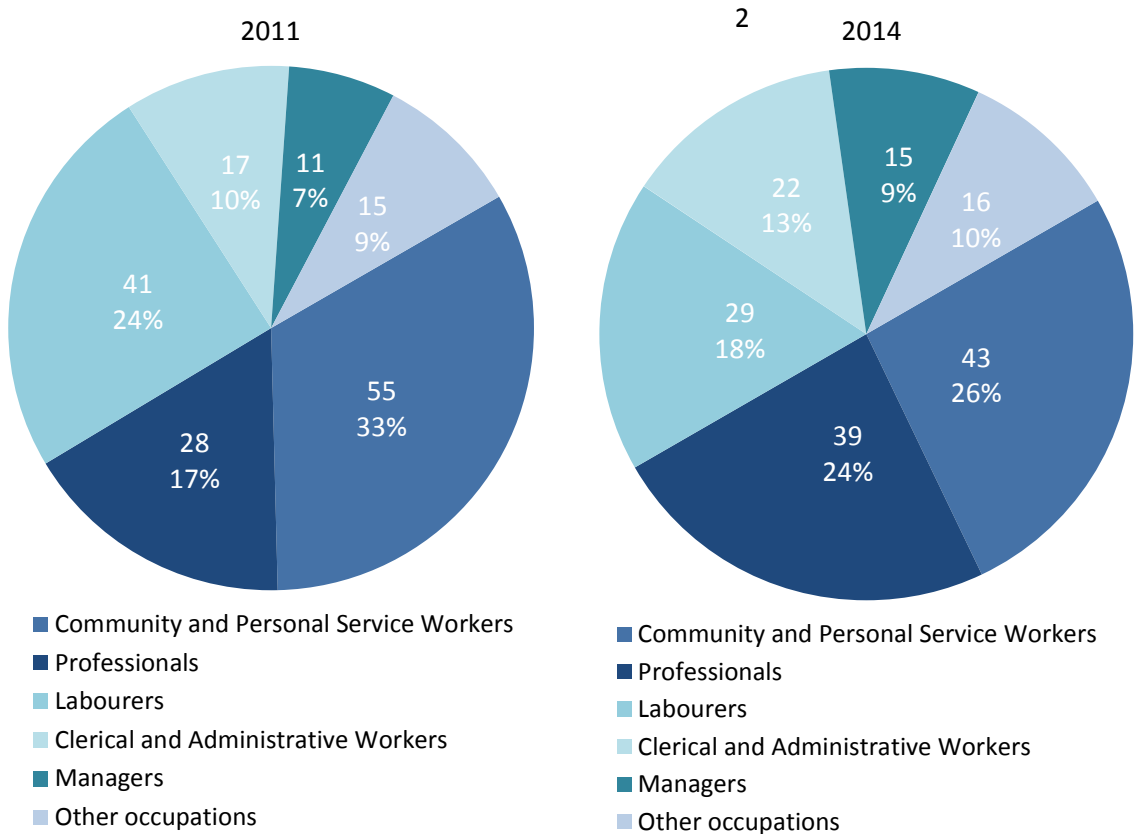

In 2014 in Daguragu/Kalkarindji:

- Community and personal service workers was the largest occupation classification in terms of filled jobs, accounting for 43 jobs (26.2% of total filled jobs), a decrease of 12 jobs from 2011
- other significant occupation classifications were:
 - Professionals (39 jobs or 23.8%) an increase of 11 jobs from 2011
 - Labourers (29 jobs or 17.7%) a decrease of 12 jobs from 2011
 - Clerical and administrative workers (22 jobs or 13.4%) an increase of 5 jobs from 2011.

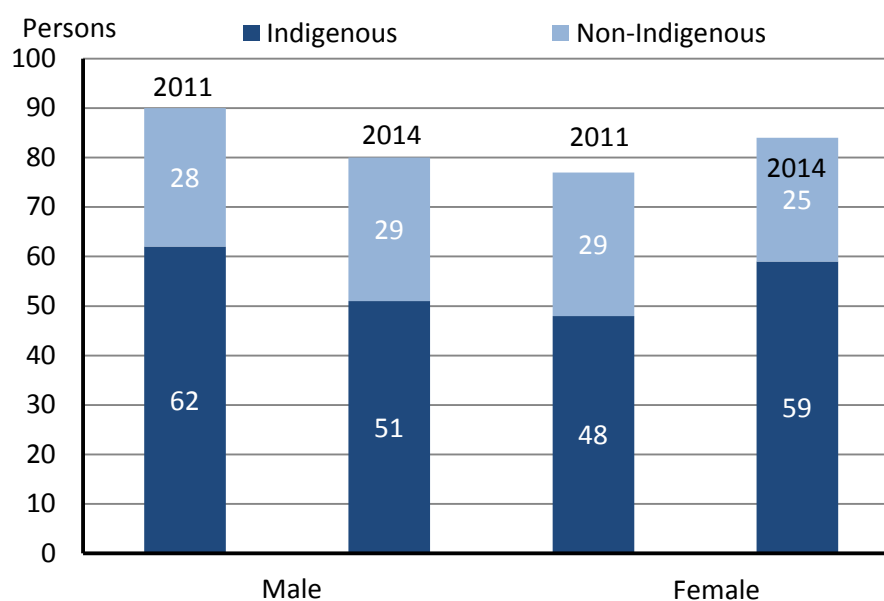

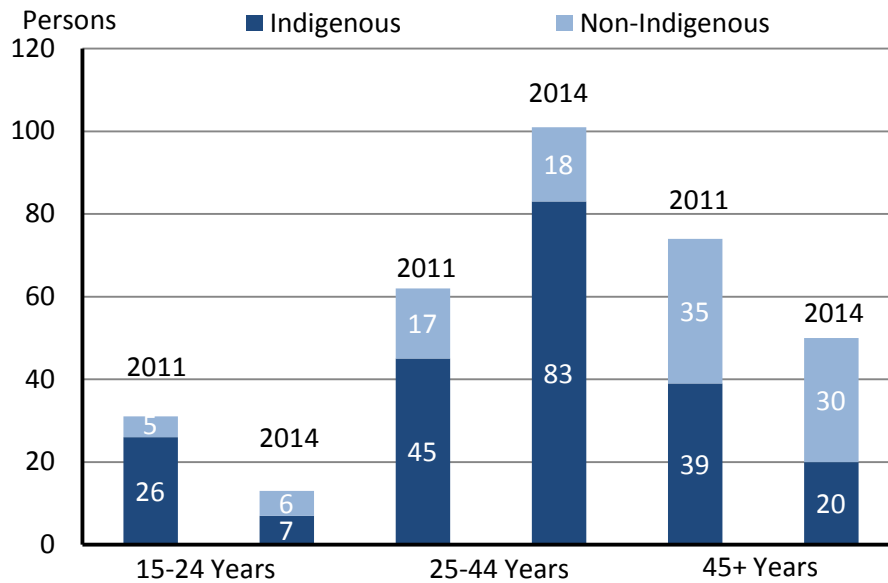

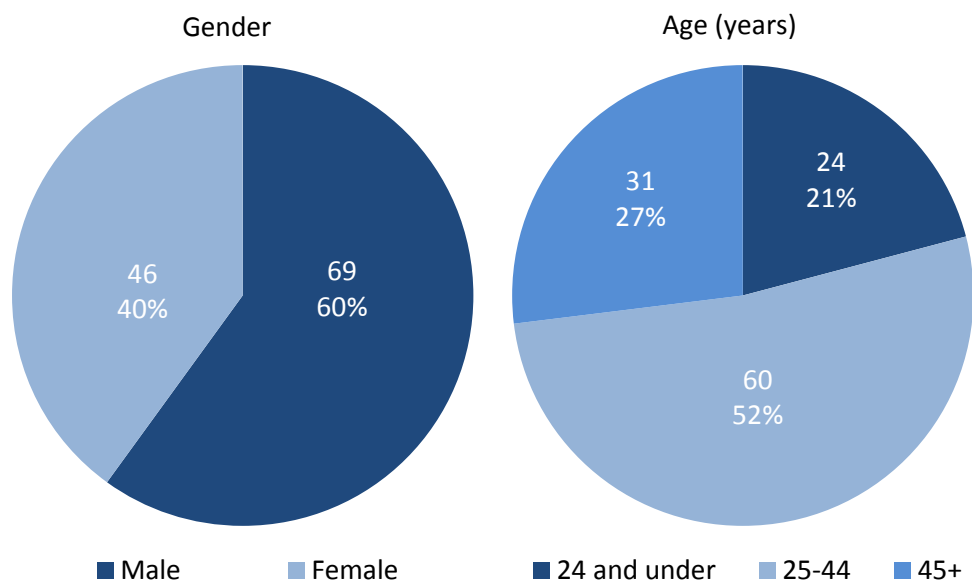
