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#### **Disclaimer**

The data in this publication was collected by conducting a survey of businesses located in the 28 remote town boundaries. This body of work was completed in 2023 by the former Northern Territory Department of Industry, Tourism and Trade.

The collection methodology was created in accordance with Australian Bureau of Statistics data quality framework principles. Data in this publication is only reflective of those businesses reported on as operating in the town at the time of data collection (see table at the end of publication for list of businesses reported on). To comply with privacy legislation or where appropriate, some data in this publication may have been adjusted and will not reflect the actual data reported by businesses. As a result of this, combined with certain data not being reported by some businesses, some components may not add to totals. Changes over time may also reflect business' change in propensity to report on certain data items rather than actual changes over time. Total figures have generally not been adjusted. Caution is advised when interpreting the comparisons made to the earlier 2011, 2014 and 2017 publications as the businesses identified and reported on and the corresponding jobs may differ between publications.

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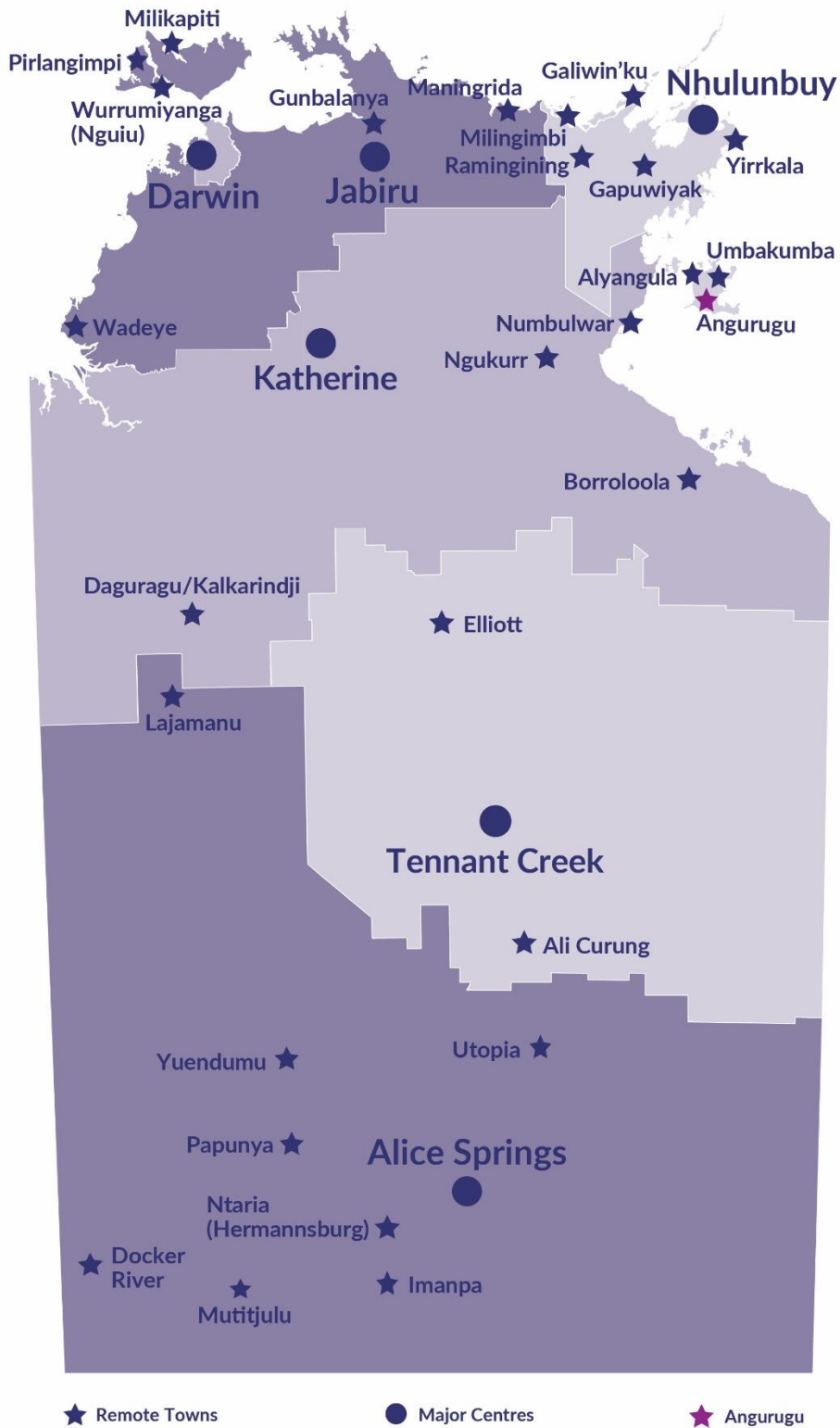
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# Angurugu

# Introduction

This jobs profile provides a snapshot of jobs and the characteristics of job holders in Angurugu as of September 2023. It also outlines trends from the 2011, 2014 and 2017 surveys.

This job profile is one of 28 profiles developed for remote towns in the Northern Territory. It is anticipated these, and subsequent profiles will contribute to a robust evidence base to inform decision making in and relating to these remote Territory towns.

This profile contains information collected by the Northern Territory Northern Territory Department of Industry, Tourism and Trade from businesses operating within the town and is supplemented by other administrative data sets and information.

Each profile provides up-to-date information that is intended to inform the planning and design of current and future government programs and as an evidence base to inform decision making relating to workforce development, enterprise and job opportunities.

The profile may best be understood as a point-in-time tool. The number of business surveys from which the data was drawn is significantly less than in earlier surveys, and business participation has decreased with each survey. For Angurugu, 27% fewer businesses than in 2017 are reported here.

The data collection methodology and corresponding questionnaire were created in partnership with the Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS) and in accordance with ABS data quality framework and survey principles.

The Northern Institute at Charles Darwin University facilitated the surveys with the support of the Northern Territory Department of Industry, Tourism and Trades' Territory Engagement and Delivery teams.

The information collected and reported on represents a significant goodwill investment by those businesses and organisations that participated. Each business is listed at the end of this publication.

# Summary

The 2023 jobs profile was developed based on responses from 11 businesses operating within the Angurugu town boundary, four less than in the 2017 survey. Of these there were:

- 5 businesses from the private sector, accounting for 110 filled jobs or 53% of total filled jobs
- 6 businesses from the public sector, accounting for 96 filled jobs or 47% of total filled jobs
- 4 businesses participated in all four surveys (completed in 2011, 2014, 2017 and 2023).

A total of 235 filled and vacant jobs in Angurugu were reported, an increase of 40 jobs from 2017.<sup>1</sup>

The 2023 profile highlights:

- of the 206 filled jobs:
  - 118 jobs (57%) were filled by Aboriginal people, an increase of 26 jobs from 2017
  - 88 jobs (43%) were filled by non-Aboriginal people, unchanged from 2017
  - 30% of employed Aboriginal people are working in the private sector
  - Aboriginal people accounted for 57% of job holders in the town compared to 51% in 2017
  - Aboriginal females made up 37.86% of total Aboriginal filled jobs in the town compared to 32.39% in 2017
- there were 29 vacant jobs, of which:
  - job vacancies as a percentage of jobs increased to 12.3% in 2023 from 7.7 % in 2017
  - job vacancies equate to 1 in 8 jobs
  - 21 of the vacancies were in the Clerical and Administrative and Community and Personal Service Workers areas.
- Public Administration and Safety was the largest industry employer, with an increase in 18 filled jobs compared to 2017
- the Administrative and Support Services industry had the greatest increase in filled jobs (40) compared to 2017
- training had a decrease of 21 student numbers between 2016 and 2023 with the largest decrease (12) in the Community Services, Health and Education training sector
- in 2023 there were only 3 VET students across the Community Services, Health and Education, and Business and Clerical training sectors.

The overall population in Angurugu increased by 48 people (5.7%) between 2011 and 2021 to 884 people.

In comparison, the overall Northern Territory population increased by 9.7% between 2011 and 2021.

In 2021, the working age population (15 years and over) in Angurugu was an estimated 723 people compared to 570 in 2011 an increase of 26.8%.

There were 0.3 jobs in Angurugu per working age person compared to 0.3 jobs per person across the NT.

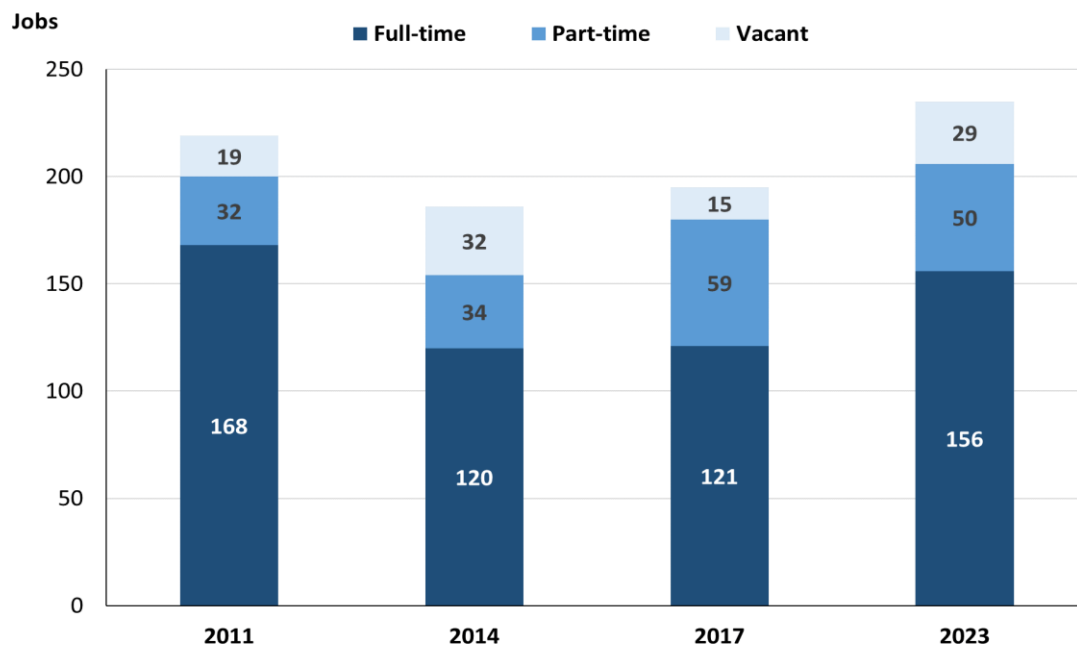

Chart 1: Count of vacant jobs and filled jobs by full-time/part-time status, 2011, 2014, 2017 & 2023 (a)(b)



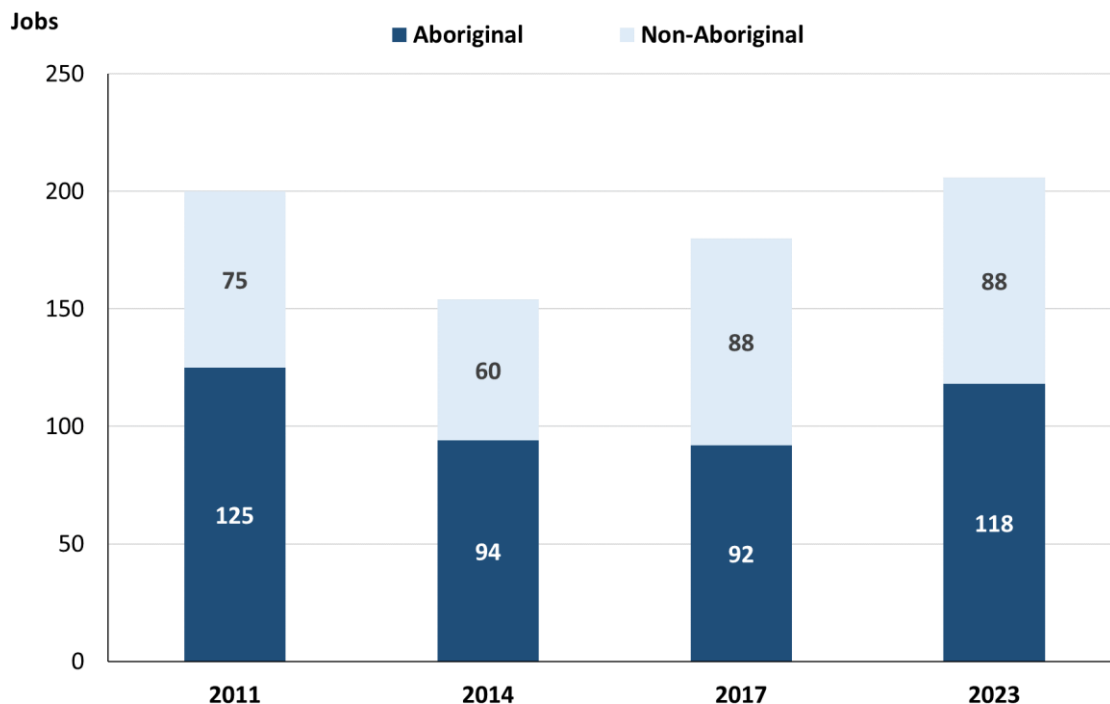

In 2023 in Angurugu:

- a total of **206 filled jobs**, an increase of 26 jobs from 2017 and an increase of 52 jobs from 2014
- of the **206 filled jobs** in 2023:
  - 156 were full-time jobs, an increase of 35 jobs from 2017 and an increase of 36 jobs from 2014
  - 50 were part-time jobs, a decrease of 9 jobs from 2017 and an increase of 16 jobs from 2014
- there were **29 job vacancies**, an increase of 14 vacancies from 2017 and a decrease of 3 vacancies from 2014.

In 2023 in Angurugu:

- of the 206 filled jobs:
  - 118 jobs were filled by **Aboriginal** people, an increase of 26 jobs from 2017 and an increase of 24 jobs from 2014
  - 88 jobs were filled by **non-Aboriginal** people, unchanged from 2017 and an increase of 28 jobs from 2014
- **Aboriginal** people accounted for 57% of job holders compared to 51% in 2017 and 61% in 2014.

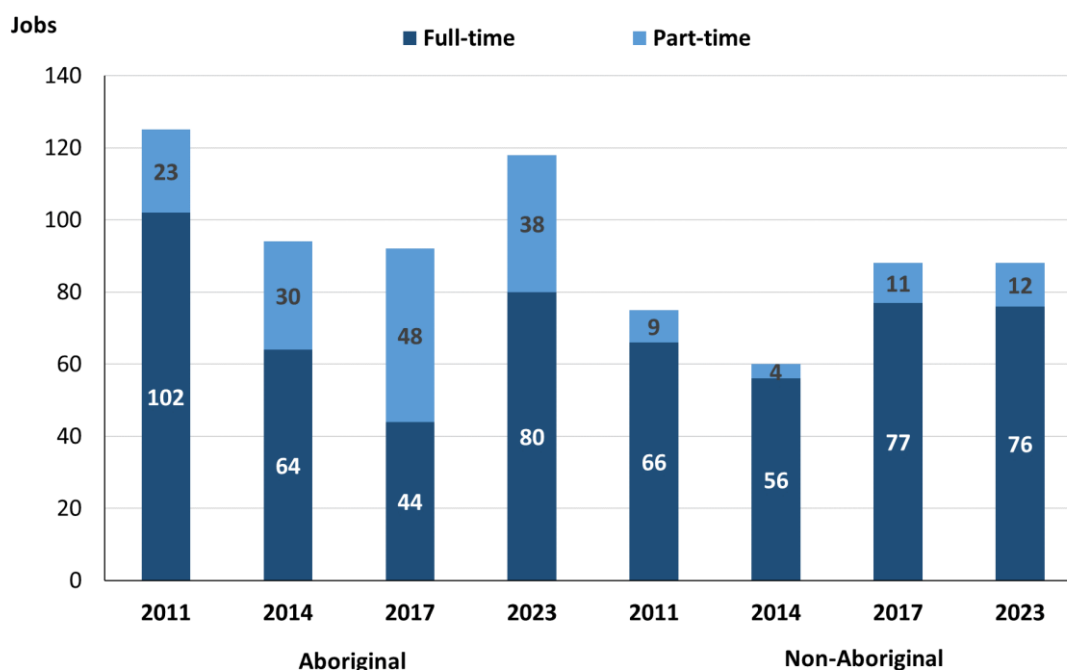

In 2023 in Angurugu:

- of the 206 filled jobs:
  - 80 were **full-time** jobs filled by **Aboriginal** people, an increase of 36 jobs from 2017 and an increase of 16 jobs from 2014
  - 38 were **part-time** jobs filled by **Aboriginal** people, a decrease of 10 jobs from 2017 and an increase of 8 jobs from 2014
  - 76 were **full-time** jobs filled by **non-Aboriginal** people, a decrease of 1 job from 2017 and an increase of 20 jobs from 2014
  - 12 were **part-time** jobs filled by **non-Aboriginal** people, an increase of 1 job from 2017 and an increase of 8 jobs from 2014.

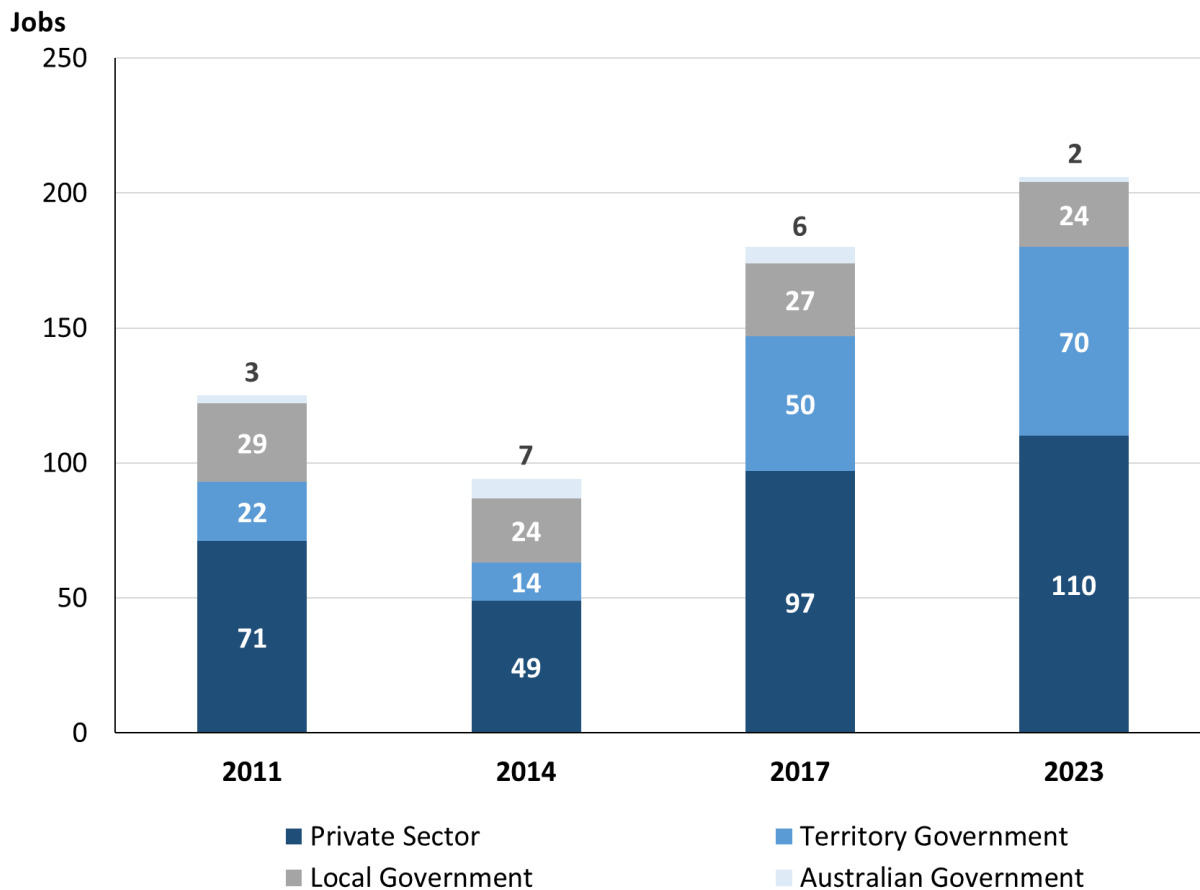

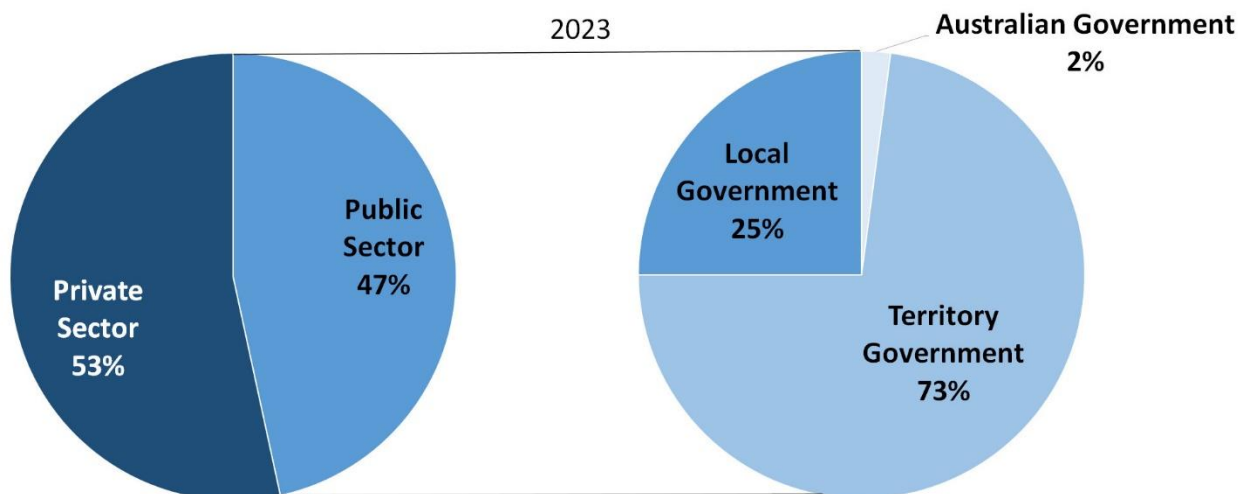

Chart 5: Percentage of filled jobs by business sector in 2023 (a)(d)

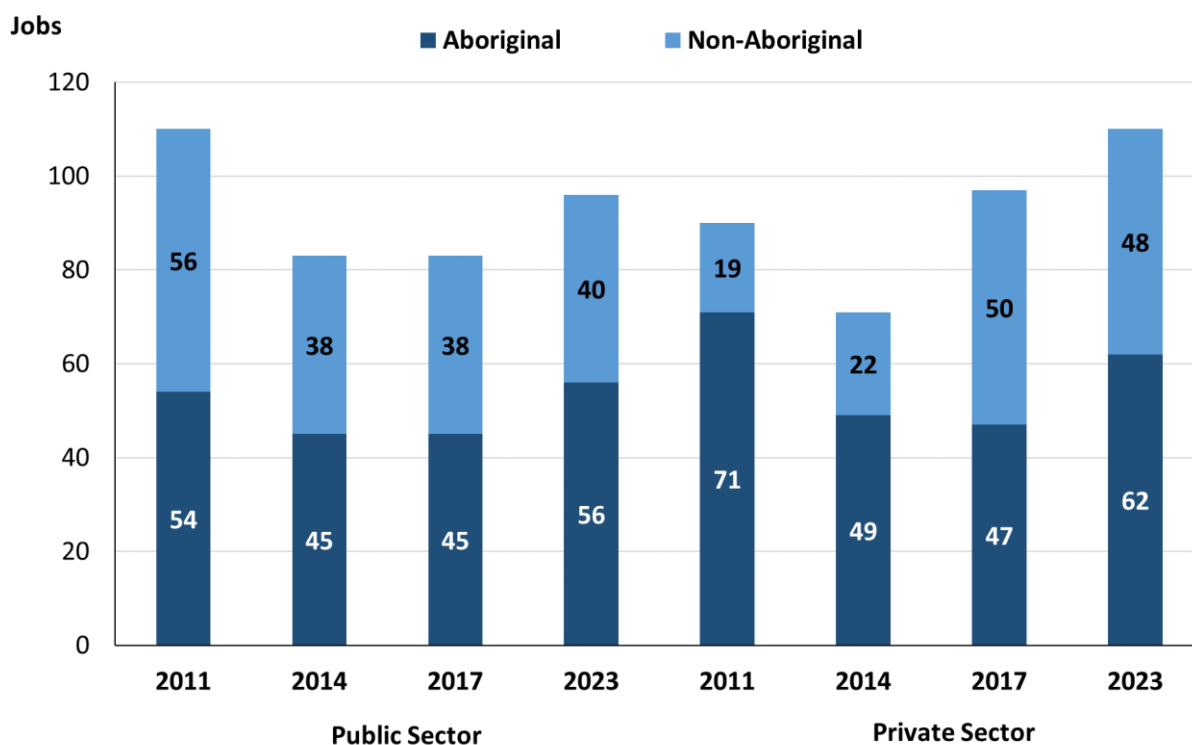

In 2023 in Angurugu:

- there were 96 jobs in the **public sector**, an increase of 13 jobs from 2017 and an increase of 13 jobs from 2014
- of the 96 jobs in the **public sector**:
  - 2 jobs were in the Australian Government, a decrease of 4 jobs from 2017 and a decrease of 6 jobs from 2014
  - 70 jobs were in the Territory Government, an increase of 20 jobs from 2017 and an increase of 28 jobs from 2014
  - 24 jobs were in the Local Government, a decrease of 3 jobs from 2017 and a decrease of 9 jobs from 2014
- there were 110 jobs in the **private sector**, an increase of 13 jobs from 2017 and an increase of 39 jobs from 2014.

Chart 6: Count of filled jobs by sector, 2011, 2014, 2017 & 2023 (a)(c)(d)

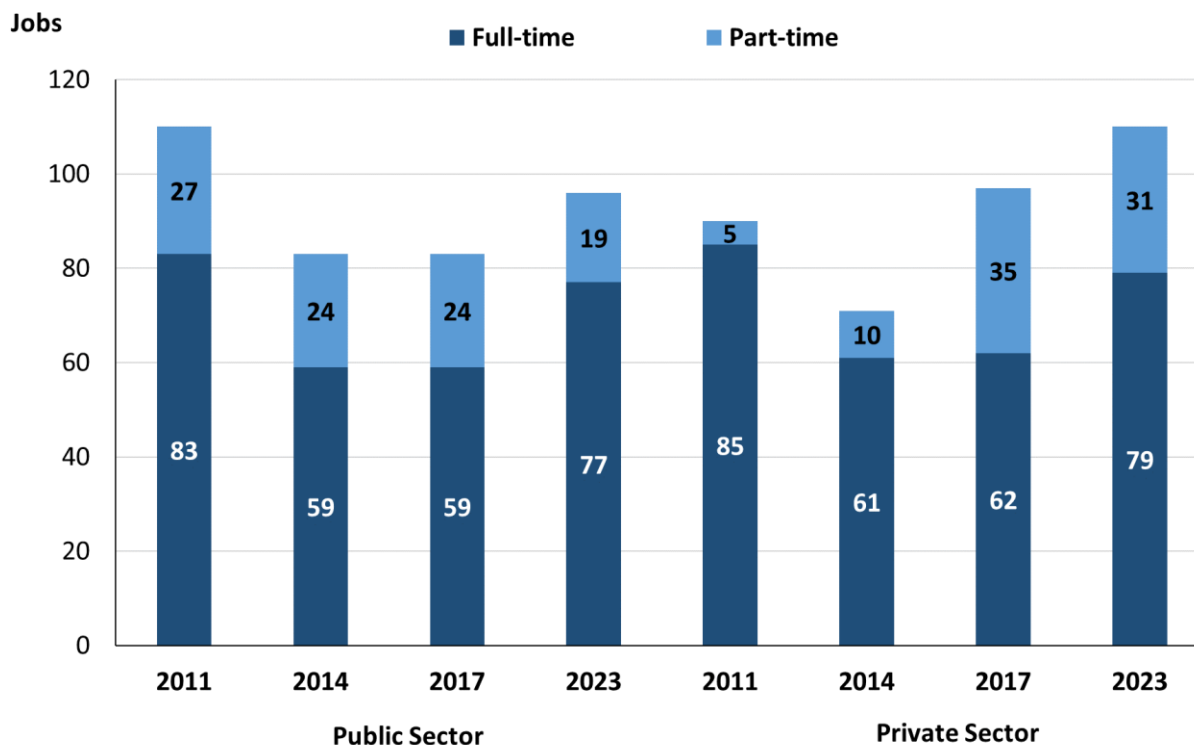

In 2023 in Angurugu:

- of the 96 jobs in the **public sector**:
  - 56 jobs were filled by **Aboriginal** people, an increase of 11 jobs from 2017 and an increase of 11 jobs from 2014
  - 40 jobs were filled by **non-Aboriginal** people, an increase of 2 jobs from 2017 and an increase of 2 jobs from 2014
- of the 110 jobs in the **private sector**:
  - 62 jobs were filled by **Aboriginal** people, an increase of 15 jobs from 2017 and an increase of 13 jobs from 2014
  - 48 jobs were filled by **non-Aboriginal** people, a decrease of 2 jobs from 2017 and an increase of 26 jobs from 2014.

- of the 96 jobs in the **Public Sector**:
  - 77 were **full-time** jobs, an increase of 18 jobs from 2017 and an increase of 18 jobs from 2014
  - 19 were **part-time** jobs, a decrease of 5 jobs from 2017 and a decrease of 5 jobs from 2014
- of the 110 jobs in the **Private Sector**:
  - 79 were **full-time** jobs, an increase of 17 jobs from 2017 and an increase of 18 jobs from 2014
  - 31 were **part-time** jobs, a decrease of 4 jobs from 2017 and an increase of 21 jobs from 2014.

- 56 jobs in the **public sector** filled by **Aboriginal** people, an increase of 11 jobs from 2017 and an increase of 11 jobs from 2014, of which:
  - 41 were **full-time** jobs, an increase of 17 jobs from 2017 and an increase of 18 jobs from 2014
  - 15 were **part-time** jobs, a decrease of 6 jobs from 2017 and a decrease of 7 jobs from 2014
- 62 jobs in the **private sector** filled by **Aboriginal** people, an increase of 15 jobs from 2017 and an increase of 13 jobs from 2014, of which:
  - 39 were **full-time** jobs, an increase of 19 jobs from 2017 and a decrease of 2 jobs from 2014
  - 23 were **part-time** jobs, a decrease of 4 jobs from 2017 and an increase of 15 jobs from 2014
- 40 jobs in the **Public Sector** filled by **non-Aboriginal** people, an increase of 2 jobs from 2017 and an increase of 2 jobs from 2014, of which:
  - 36 were **full-time** jobs, an increase of 1 job from 2017 and unchanged from 2014
  - 4 were **part-time** jobs, an increase of 1 job from 2017 and an increase of 2 jobs from 2014
- 48 jobs in the **Private Sector** filled by **non-Aboriginal** people, a decrease of 2 jobs from 2017 and an increase of 26 jobs from 2014, of which:
  - 40 were **full-time** jobs, a decrease of 2 jobs from 2017 and an increase of 20 jobs from 2014
  - 8 were **part-time** jobs, unchanged from 2017 and an increase of 6 jobs from 2014.

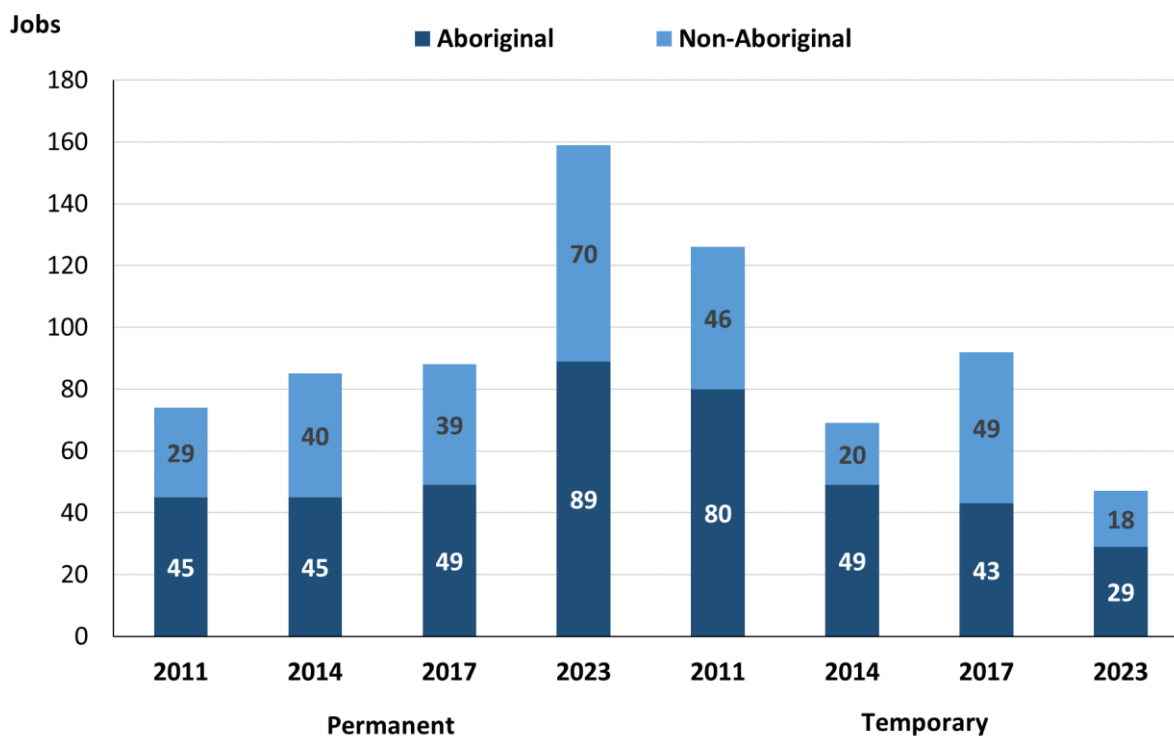

In 2023 in Angurugu:

- there were 159 **Permanent jobs**, an increase of 71 jobs from 2017, and an increase of 74 jobs from 2014, of which:
  - **Aboriginal** people filled 89 jobs, an increase of 40 jobs from 2017 and an increase of 44 jobs from 2014
  - **non-Aboriginal** people filled 70 jobs, an increase of 31 jobs from 2017 and an increase of 30 jobs from 2014
- there were 47 **Temporary jobs**, a decrease of 45 jobs from 2017 and a decrease of 22 jobs from 2014, of which:
  - **Aboriginal** people filled 29 jobs, a decrease of 14 jobs from 2017 and a decrease of 20 jobs from 2014
  - **non-Aboriginal** people filled 18 jobs, a decrease of 31 jobs from 2017 and a decrease of 2 jobs from 2014.

- 96 jobs in the **public sector**, an increase of 13 jobs from 2017 and an increase of 13 jobs from 2014, of which:
  - 50 jobs were **permanent**, an increase of 13 jobs from 2017 and a decrease of 9 jobs from 2014, of which:
    - ♦ **Aboriginal** people filled 27 jobs, an increase of 1 job from 2017 and a decrease of 1 job from 2014
    - ♦ **non-Aboriginal** people filled 23 jobs, an increase of 12 jobs from 2017 and a decrease of 8 jobs from 2014
  - 46 jobs were **temporary**, unchanged from 2017 and an increase of 22 jobs from 2014, of which:
    - ♦ **Aboriginal** people filled 29 jobs, an increase of 10 jobs from 2017 and an increase of 12 jobs from 2014
    - ♦ **non-Aboriginal** people filled 17 jobs, a decrease of 10 jobs from 2017 and an increase of 10 jobs from 2014
- 110 jobs in the **private sector**, an increase of 13 jobs from 2017 and an increase of 39 jobs from 2014, of which:
  - 109 jobs were **permanent**, an increase of 58 jobs from 2017 and an increase of 83 jobs from 2014, of which:
    - ♦ **Aboriginal** people filled 62 jobs, an increase of 39 jobs from 2017 and an increase of 45 jobs from 2014
    - ♦ **non-Aboriginal** people filled 47 jobs, an increase of 19 jobs from 2017 and an increase of 38 jobs from 2014
  - 1 job was **temporary**, a decrease of 45 jobs from 2017 and a decrease of 44 jobs from 2014, of which:
    - ♦ **Aboriginal** people held no jobs, a decrease of 24 jobs from 2017 and a decrease of 32 jobs from 2014
    - ♦ a **non-Aboriginal** person held 1 job, a decrease of 21 jobs from 2017 and a decrease of 12 jobs from 2014.

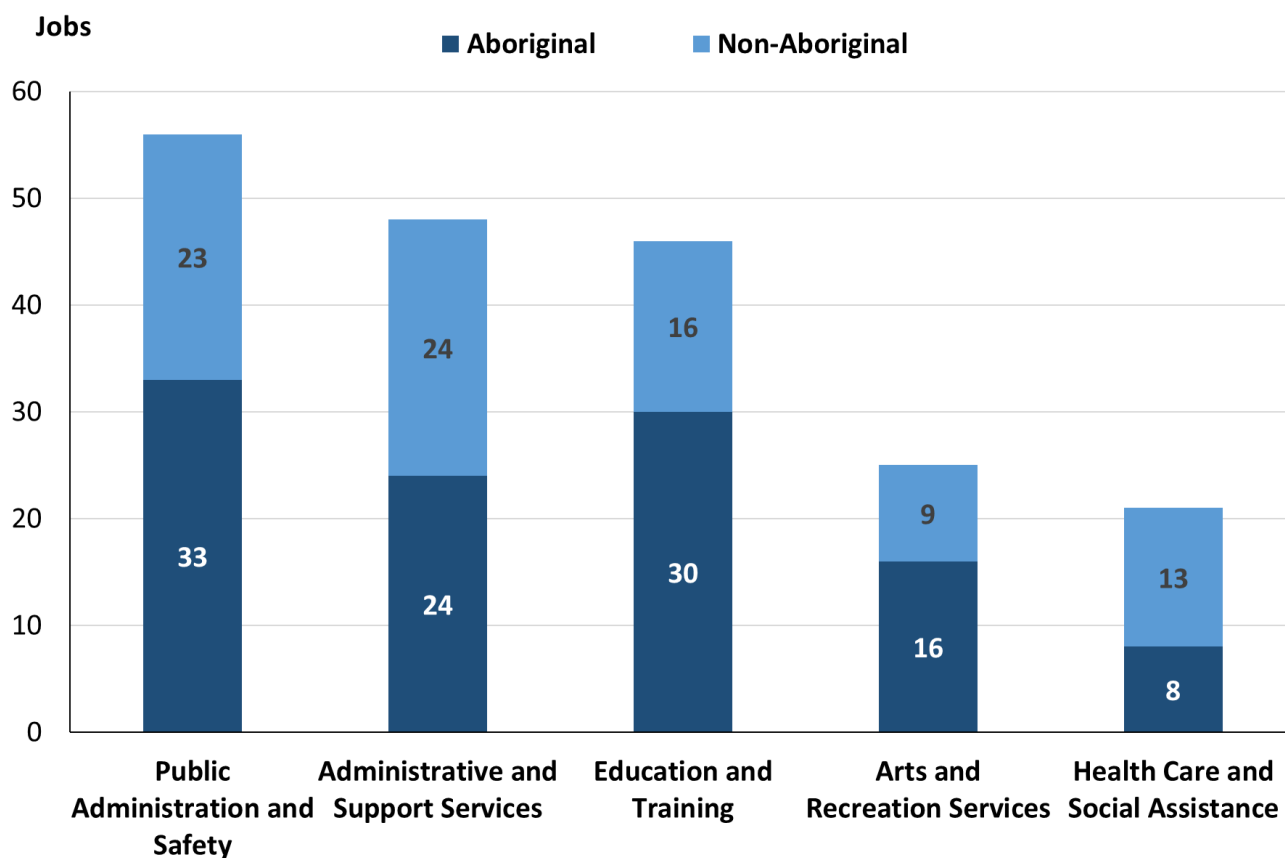

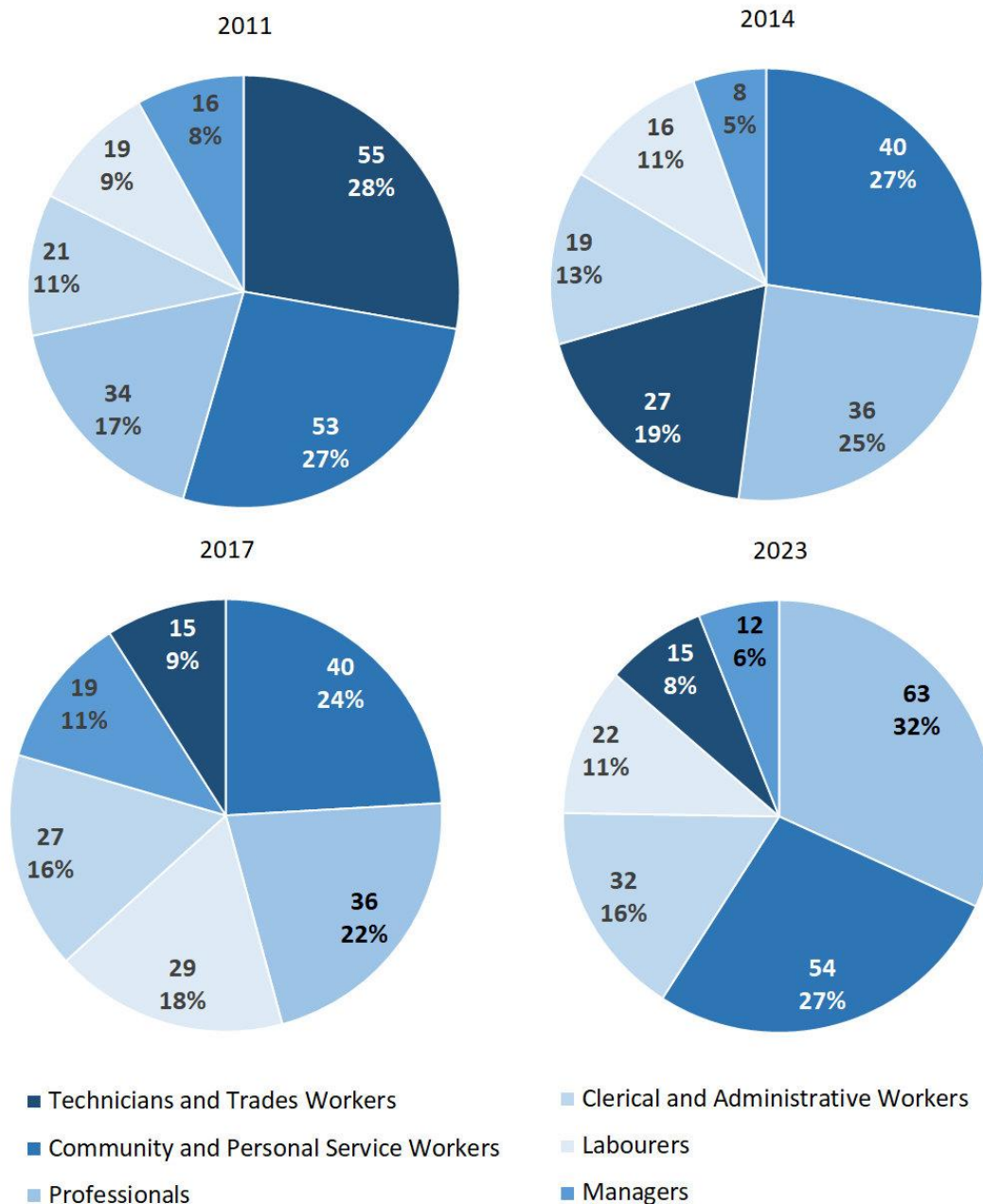

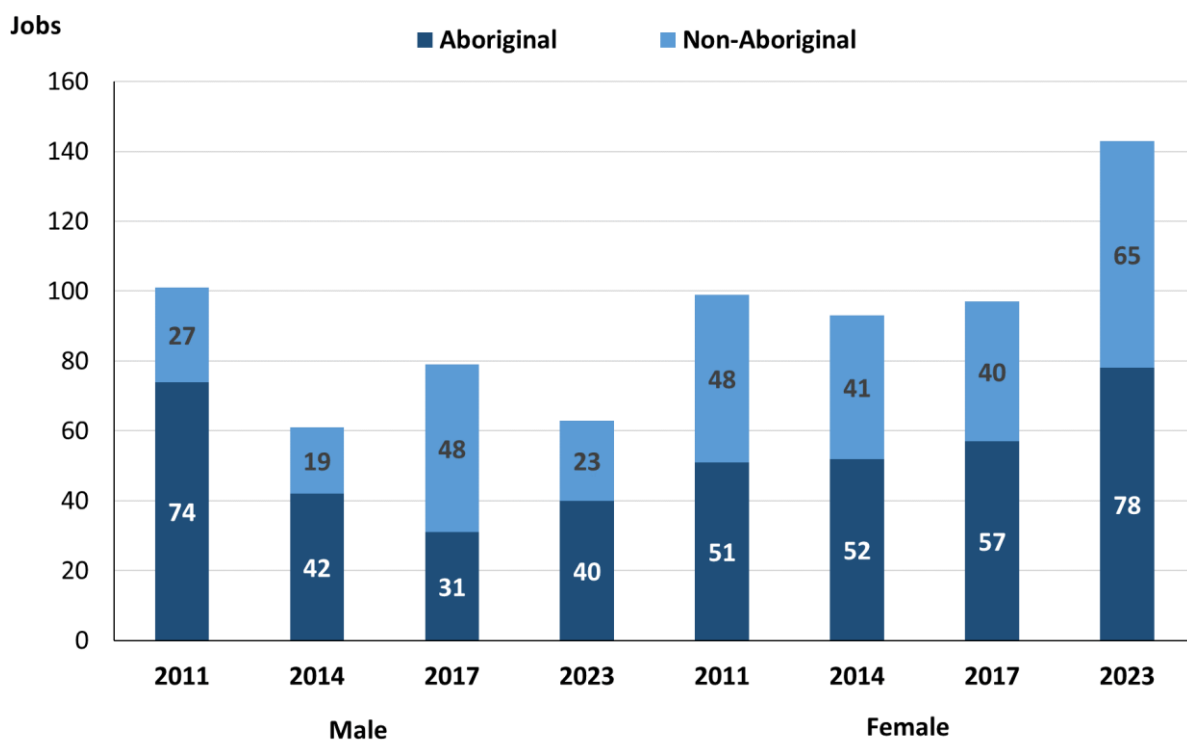

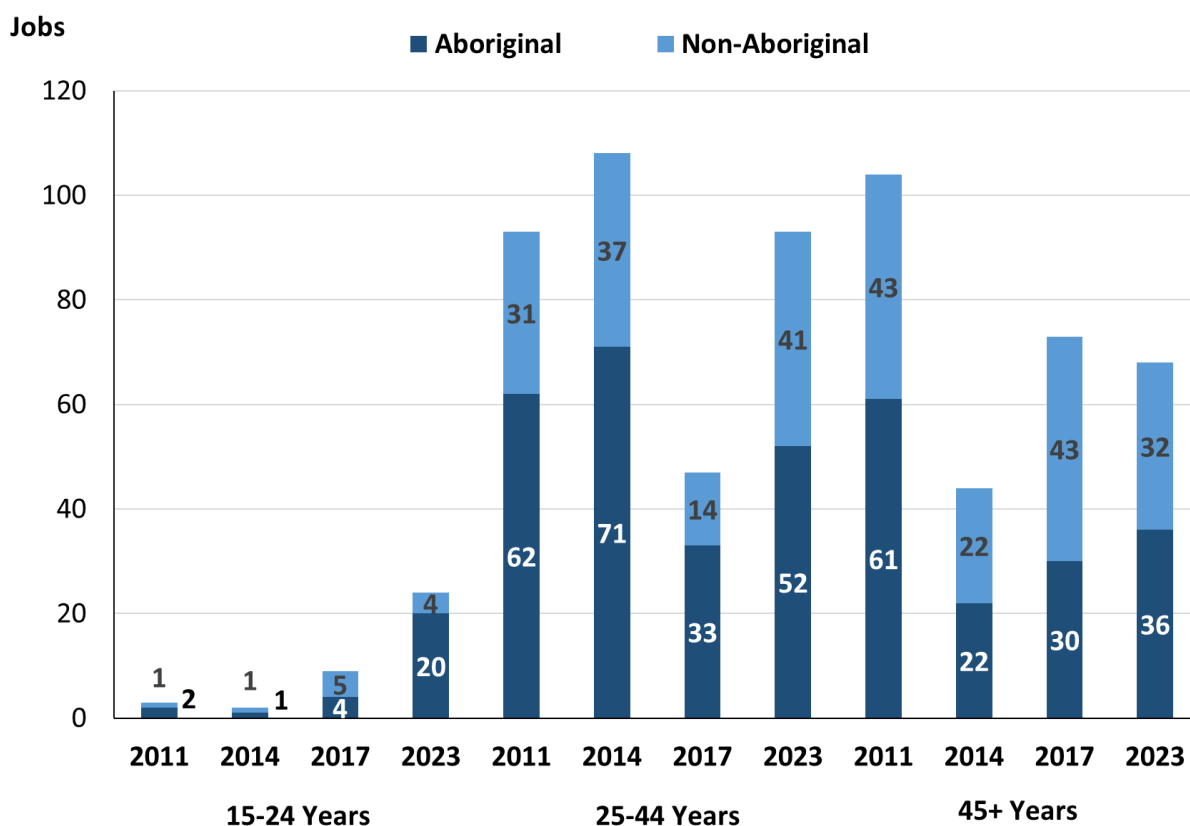

The impact of the Remote Jobs and Communities Program (RJCP) being established in 2013 has played a significant role in the downturn of accredited training in many remote towns across the Territory.

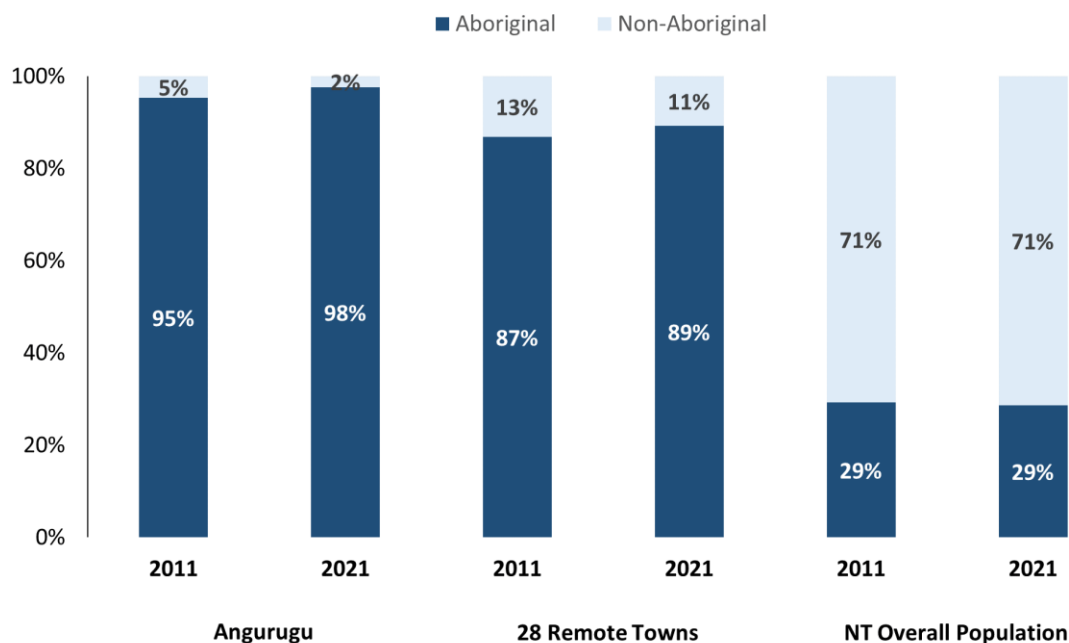

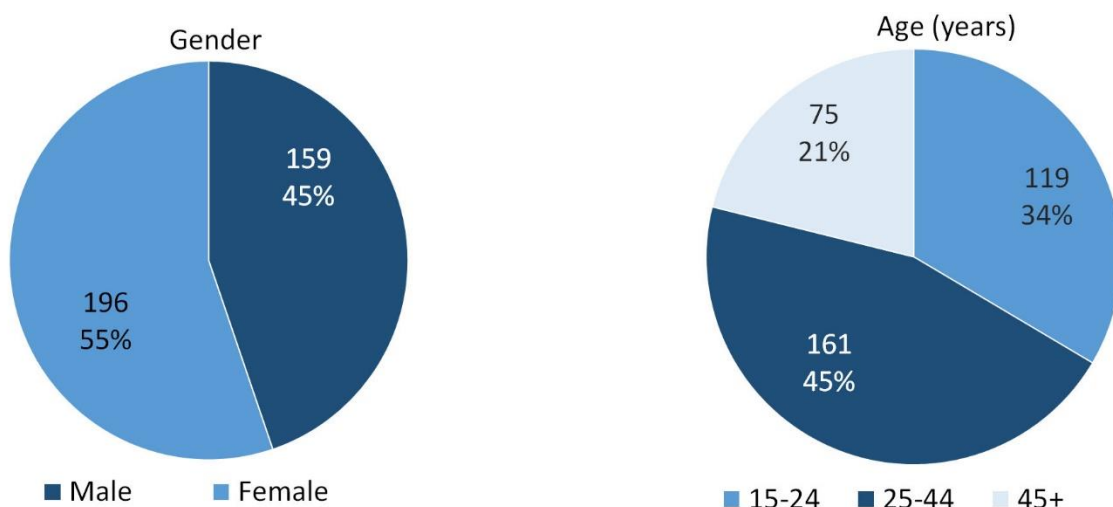
