
## Where does the water come from?

When it rains the termites start to busily build their nests.




### When it rains the rivers and creeks start to flow and the rock holes fill up.

We like having water to keep the lawn green and water the flowers.




After it has rained the frogs come out and make lots of noise.

Sometimes you can see the kangaroos have a drink from the waterhole when it is full.


And the rain can make some of the plants flower.
