Motor Vehicles Act 1949 / Traffic Act 1987

Power Assisted Wheelchair Exemption

I, Simon Phillip Saunders, Registrar of Motor Vehicles, under to section 135 of the *Motor Vehicles Act 1949* and section 43B of the *Traffic Act 1987*, exempt the class of vehicles identified in Item 1 of the Schedule to this instrument (referred to in this instrument as “Exempt Class”), from the registration, motor accident compensation contributions, vehicle standards and driver licensing requirements of the *Motor Vehicles Act 1949*, *Traffic Act 1987* and the *Motor Vehicles (Standards) Regulations 2003*, subject to conditions specified in item 2 of the Schedule:

Schedule

1. **Exempt Class**

“**power assisted wheelchair**” means a wheelchair that is propelled primarily by the energy input of the wheelchair user that -

- a) is modified, adapted or fitted with an add-on electrical power unit; and
- b) is capable of travelling at a speed greater than 10 km/h.

2. **Conditions**

- a) A person must not use an exempt vehicle at a speed over 10km/h.
- b) A person using an exempt vehicle on a footpath or shared path must—
 - (i) keep to the left of the footpath or shared path unless it is impracticable to do so;
 - (ii) give way to pedestrians on the footpath or shared path; and
 - (iii) obey all rules for pedestrians in the Australian Road Rules Part 14 Division 1.
- c) A person using an exempt vehicle must not carry or transport any other person on the exempt vehicle.
- d) A person must not use an exempt vehicle at night, or in hazardous weather conditions causing reduced visibility, unless the person, or the exempt vehicle, displays—
 - (i) a flashing or steady white light that is clearly visible for at least 200m from the front of the exempt vehicle; and
 - (ii) a flashing or steady red light that is clearly visible for at least 200m from the rear of the exempt vehicle.

- e) A person using an exempt vehicle must not travel along a road unless either—
- (i) there is an obstruction on a footpath, nature strip, or shared path adjacent to the road (an adjacent area); and
 - (ii) it is impracticable to travel on the adjacent area; and
 - (iii) an exempt vehicle travels less than 50m along the road to avoid the obstruction; or
 - (iv) the use of an exempt vehicle on that road is permitted by the relevant authority having the care control and management of the road.

Note:

For the purposes of this condition, road means an area that is used by the public and is developed for, or has as one of its main uses, the driving or riding of motor vehicles, and includes the shoulder of the road (within the meaning of Australian Road Rule 12(3)) and any bicycle lane (within the meaning of Australian Road Rule 153(4)) marked on the road.
