Personal Injuries (Liabilities and Damages) Act 2003

Declaration of Maximum Amount of Damages for Non-Pecuniary Loss

I, Selena Jane Malijarri Uibo, Attorney-General and Minister for Justice, under section 28(1) of the *Personal Injuries (Liabilities and Damages) Act 2003*:

- (a) declare that the maximum amount of damages a court may award for non-pecuniary loss, applicable for section 27(1) of the Act, is \$686 500; and
- (b) state that this declaration takes effect on 1 October 2021.

Education Act 2015 Education Regulations 2015

Determination of Fees: International Students and Distance Education Centres

I, Lauren Jane Moss, Minister for Education:

- (a) under regulation 14(1) of the Education Regulations 2015, and with reference to section 67(1) of the Education Act 2015, determine that the fees payable by international students enrolled in Government schools are:
 - (i) for education services provided by a Government school to an international student with a visa of a subclass specified in Schedule 1, Part A or Part B:
 - (A) for a year at a year level specified in Schedule 1 for the subclass – the fee specified opposite in Schedule 1 for the year level during the specified calendar year; or
 - (B) if the student is enrolled at a Government school for less than a year – the fee referred to in subparagraph (A) adjusted on a pro-rata basis; and
 - (ii) for the provision of facilities or arrangements for a student's accommodation – the fee specified in Schedule 2 each time the student is placed in accommodation.
- (b) under regulation 14(2) of the Education Regulations 2015, and with reference to section 69(1) of the Education Act 2015, determine that the fees payable for the provision of education services by distance education centres to a student of a class mentioned in section 69(1) of the Act are:

- (i) for a year at a year level specified in Schedule 3 the fee specified opposite in Schedule 3 for the year level during the specified calendar year; or
- (ii) if the student is enrolled at a Government school for less than a year the fee referred to in subparagraph (i) adjusted on a pro-rata basis.

Petroleum Act 1984

Release of Information under Section 61(8)
