## **Appointment of Additional Public Holidays**

I, Jo-Anne Hersey, Minister for Public Service, under section 6 of the *Public Holidays Act 1981*, appoint:

- (a) each of the following days to be a public holiday to be observed in the part of the Territory specified in Schedule 1 by all sections of the community within that specified part of the Territory:
  - (i) Friday 23 July 2027 (Darwin Regional Show Day);
  - (ii) Friday 28 July 2028 (Darwin Regional Show Day);
  - (iii) Friday 27 July 2029 (Darwin Regional Show Day); and
- (b) each of the following days to be a public holiday to be observed in the part of the Territory specified in Schedule 2 by all sections of the community within that specified part of the Territory:
  - (i) Friday 16 July 2027 (Katherine Regional Show Day);
  - (ii) Friday 21 July 2028 (Katherine Regional Show Day);
  - (iii) Friday 20 July 2029 (Katherine Regional Show Day); and

- (c) each of the following days to be a public holiday to be observed in the part of the Territory specified in Schedule 3 by all sections of the community within that specified part of the Territory:
  - (i) Friday 9 July 2027 (Tennant Creek Regional Show Day);
  - (ii) Friday 14 July 2028 (Tennant Creek Regional Show Day);
  - (iii) Friday 13 July 2029 (Tennant Creek Regional Show Day); and
- (d) each of the following days to be a public holiday to be observed in the part of the Territory specified in Schedule 4 by all sections of the community within that specified part of the Territory:
  - (i) Friday 2 July 2027 (Alice Springs Regional Show Day);
  - (ii) Friday 7 July 2028 (Alice Springs Regional Show Day);
  - (iii) Friday 6 July 2029 (Alice Springs Regional Show Day); and
- (e) each of the following days to be a public holiday to be observed in the part of the Territory specified in Schedule 5 by all sections of the community within that specified part of the Territory:
  - (i) Friday 13 August 2027 (Borroloola Regional Show day);
  - (ii) Friday 11 August 2028 (Borroloola Regional Show day);
  - (iii) Friday 10 August 2029 (Borroloola Regional Show day).

## **Schedule 1**

All that parcel of land in the Northern Territory of Australia described as follows:

the part of the Northern Territory of Australia north of the parallel of south latitude 13 degrees 34 minutes and of the parts of the Northern Territory of Australia being the whole of the Anindilyakwa area described in Schedule 6 to the *Aboriginal Land Rights (Northern Territory) Act 1976* (Cth) and the whole of the Daly River area described in Schedule 1, Part 1 to that Act.

## **Schedule 2**

All that parcel of land in the Northern Territory of Australia bounded by lines described as follows:

commencing at the intersection of the parallel of south latitude 13 degrees 34 minutes with the sea coast of the Gulf of Carpentaria; thence generally southerly and south-easterly by the said sea coast to intersect the parallel of south latitude 15 degrees 30 minutes; thence west by the said parallel to intersect the meridian of east longitude 135 degrees; thence south by the said meridian to intersect the easterly prolongation of the northern boundary of Northern Territory Portion 2845; thence westerly by the said prolongation, the northern boundary of Northern Territory Portion 2845 and part of the northern boundary of Perpetual Pastoral Lease 1003 (Cattle Creek) to intersect the meridian of east longitude 132 degrees; thence south by the said meridian to intersect the easterly prolongation of the northern boundary of Pastoral Lease 826 (Suplejack); thence westerly by the said prolongation, the northern boundary of Pastoral Lease 826 and its westerly prolongation to intersect the meridian of east longitude 129 degrees being Northern Territory and Western Australia border; thence north by the said meridian to intersect the sea coast of the Timor Sea; thence generally easterly by the said sea coast to intersect the left bank of the Fitzmaurice River; thence generally easterly by the said left bank to intersect the southerly prolongation of the most easterly boundary of Northern Territory Portion 1637; thence northerly, westerly and again northerly by the said prolongation, an eastern, a northern and an eastern boundary of the said Portion to intersect the parallel of south point of commencement, thence easterly by the said parallel to the point of commencement, and including all Northern Territory of Australia coastal islands

between the parallels of south latitude 13 degrees 34 minutes and 15 degrees 30 minutes, but excluding therefrom all islands within the Anindilyakwa area described in Schedule 6 to the *Aboriginal Land Rights (Northern Territory) Act 1976* (Cth).

### **Schedule 3**

All that parcel of land in the Northern Territory of Australia bounded by lines described as follows:

commencing at the intersection of the parallel of south latitude 21 degrees 12 minutes with the meridian of east longitude 138 degrees being a point on the Northern Territory and Queensland border; thence west by the said parallel to intersect the meridian of east longitude 132 degrees; thence north by the said meridian to intersect the northern boundary of Perpetual Pastoral Lease 1003 (Cattle Creek); thence easterly by part of the said boundary, the northern boundary of Northern Territory Portion 2845 and its easterly prolongation to intersect the meridian of east longitude 135 degrees; thence sought by the said meridian to intersect the parallel of south latitude 18 degrees 30 minutes; thence east by the said parallel to intersect the meridian of east longitude 138 degrees being the Northern Territory and Queensland border; thence south by the said border to the point of commencement.

### **Schedule 4**

All that parcel of land in the Northern Territory of Australia bounded by lines described as follows:

commencing at the intersection of the parallel of south latitude 21 degrees 12 minutes with the meridian of east longitude 138 degrees being a point on the Northern Territory and Queensland border; thence south by the said meridian to intersect parallel of south latitude 26 degrees being the south-eastern corner of the Northern Territory; thence west by the said parallel to intersect meridian of east longitude 129 degrees being the south-western corner of the Northern Territory; thence north by the said meridian to intersect the westerly prolongation of the northern boundary of Pastoral Lease 826 (Suplejack); thence easterly by the said prolongation, the northern boundary of Pastoral Lease 826

and its prolongation easterly to intersect meridian of east longitude 132 degrees; thence south by the said meridian to intersect parallel of south latitude 21 degrees 12 minutes; thence east by the said parallel to the point of commencement.

#### **Schedule 5**

All that parcel of land in the Northern Territory of Australia bounded by lines described as follows:

commencing at the intersection of the parallel of south latitude 18 degrees 30 minutes with the meridian of east longitude 138 degrees being a point on the Northern Territory and Queensland border; thence west by the said parallel to intersect the meridian of east longitude 135 degrees; thence north by the said meridian to intersect the parallel of south latitude 15 degrees 30 minutes; thence east by the said parallel to intersect the sea coast of the Gulf of Carpentaria, thence generally south-easterly by the said sea coast to intersect the meridian of east longitude 138 degrees; thence south by the said meridian to the point of commencement, and including all Northern Territory of Australia coastal islands south of parallel of south latitude 15 degrees 30 minutes.
