REASONS FOR DECISION IN RELATION TO PROPOSED EXCEPTIONAL DEVELOPMENT PERMIT

The decision to grant an Exceptional Development Permit for delegate of the Minister for Lands, Planning and Environment for the purpose of an outbuilding (garden shed) addition to a residential care facility was made pursuant to section 40(2)(a) of the *Planning Act 1999* for the following reasons:

- 1. the proposed works will not alter a "measurable aspect" of the existing buildings, landscaping or car parking works on the basis that:
 - no landscaping (planting will be removed) and the selected location avoids pathways; and
 - the shed is an ancillary component of the primary land use and more specifically, will be located within an existing communal open space area and does not increase the intensity of the facility use.
