# **Key Discussion Points**

#### **Pastoral Land Board Correspondence**

The Pastoral Land Board provided advice on the impacts of the declaration of buffel grass as a weed on the Land Condition Monitoring undertaken on pastoral leases. The WAC will continue discussing this matter with the PLB.

#### **Member Updates**

Members provided updates on their organisations activities around buffel grass management since the WAC last met (February 2025). Many organisations had undertaken significant buffel management work in response to the rainfall event in March. Buffel control is being factored into annual work plans for the non-pastoral land managers and opportunities for collaboration were discussed.

NTCA representatives indicated they had held their annual conference in March and NTCA members had expressed their dissatisfaction with the declaration of buffel grass as a weed. Other WAC members reported increased engagement and efforts since declaration.

#### **WAC Business**

Terms of Reference:

Weed Management Branch (WMB) staff indicated they will be seeking approval from the Minister for the updated Terms of Reference. These updates are based on directions supplied by the Minister, to allow for the appointment of standing proxies and to clarify some procedural matters.

#### **Guest Presentation**

The WAC heard from Troy Bowman, the South Australia State Buffel Grass Co-ordinator. He spoke about how buffel grass is managed and regulated in SA, as outlined in their Strategic Plan and the Declared Plant Policy. On an operational level, Troy provided an overview of the key successes and learnings from the SA program. Troy also touched on some of the national efforts, such as the Weed of National Significance nomination.

## Strategic Weed Management Plan

The WAC held a workshop to further progress the Buffel Grass draft Weed Management Plan (WMP). Key points included:

- Recap of discussions undertaken at the last WAC meeting around the purpose of a WMP; required and optional content as outlined in the Weeds Management Act 2001.
- The WAC discussed some proposed management requirements in detail. The WAC was able to broadly agree on some points, while others require further discussion and consideration.
- The WAC agreed to develop a package of supporting information to accompany the draft WMP when it is released for public comment; this will include facts sheets for different stakeholder groups, technical advice and information.
