- 7. That access to the swimming pool/spa is not prevented only by a perimeter boundary (Section 11(2)).
- 8. That the swimming pool/spa enclosure is of the type and height as **specified in the sketch at Part 5** of this form, including whether windows and or doors form part of the barrier.
- 9. I / We have/have not received the advice of a Pool Safety Adviser that did/did not include an inspection of the swimming pool/spa enclosure.
- 10. If the dividing barrier of your property is being used as part of the enclosure for the swimming pool/spa, a [A1 - Dividing Pool/Spa Barrier Notice \(nt.gov.au\)](http://nt.gov.au) must be given to the owner of each relevant adjoining premises before making this declaration.
