Medicines, Poisons and Therapeutic Goods Act 2012

Prescribed Qualifications to Supply, Administer or Possess Vaccines

I, Charles Hawkurst Pain, Acting Chief Health Officer:

- (a) under section 63(2) of the *Medicines, Poisons and Therapeutic Goods Act 2012* (the **Act**) and with reference to section 43 of the *Interpretation Act 1978*, revoke the prescription of qualifications in relation to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander health practitioners made by instrument entitled "Prescribed Qualifications for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Health Practitioners to Supply, Administer or Possess Vaccines" dated 30 April 2019 and published in *Gazette* No. G21 of 22 May 2019; and
- (b) under section 65(1A) of the Act and with reference to section 43 of the *Interpretation Act 1978*, revoke the prescription of qualifications in relation to nurses and midwives made by instrument entitled "Prescribed Qualifications for Nurses and Midwives to Supply, Administer or Possess Vaccines" dated 15 May 2017 and published in *Gazette* No. S25 of 16 May 2017; and
- (c) under section 63(2) of the Act and with reference to section 42(1) of the *Interpretation Act 1978*, prescribe the qualifications specified in Schedule 1 as the qualifications required for an Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander health practitioner, in the course of practising in the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander health practice profession, to supply or administer a Schedule 4 substance that is a vaccine to another person, and to possess the substance for those purposes, subject to the conditions and limitations specified in Schedule 1; and
- (d) under section 65(1A) of the Act and with reference to section 42(1) of the *Interpretation Act 1978*, prescribe the qualifications specified in Schedule 2 as the qualifications required for a nurse or midwife, in the course of

practising in the nursing or midwifery profession, to supply or administer a Schedule 4 substance that is a vaccine to another person, and to possess the substance for those purposes, subject to the conditions and limitations specified in Schedule 2.

Schedule 1 Prescribed qualifications for an Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander health practitioner

Part A

1 In this Schedule:

NT upskill course means the 'About Giving Vaccines Upskill' course (RAHC ACRRM ID: 20369) provided by the Remote Area Health Corps.

previously prescribed course means a course that was:

- (a) previously prescribed for section 63(2) of the Act; and
- (b) described in an instrument that is mentioned in Column 1 of Part C of this Schedule.

previously prescribed refresher course means a course that was:

- (a) previously prescribed for section 63(2) of the Act; and
- (b) described in an instrument that is mentioned in Part D of this Schedule.

refresher course means an immunisation refresher course delivered by:

- (a) the provider of a relevant course; or
- (b) a provider accredited by Health Education Services Australia.

relevant course means a course listed in Part B of this Schedule.

vaccination date means the date on which the Schedule 4 substance that is a vaccine is to be supplied or administered by the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander health practitioner to the other person.

- 2 The Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander health practitioner (the ***practitioner***) must be registered without conditions under the Health Practitioner Regulation National Law.
- 3 The practitioner must have completed:
 - (a) an Immunisation Education Program accredited by Health Education Services Australia; or
 - (b) a relevant course; or
 - (c) a previously prescribed course which is recognised in accordance with clause 5.
- 4 A practitioner is to be regarded as having completed a course referred to in clause 3 if the practitioner has fulfilled all of the requirements, and passed all of the assessments, for the course.
- 5 For clause 3(c), a previously prescribed course continues to be recognised as a prescribed qualification for section 63(2) of the Act if:
 - (a) the course was undertaken or completed by the practitioner within the period of time that is specified opposite the course in Column 2 of Part C of this Schedule; or
 - (b) the practitioner:
 - (i) enrolled in the course within the period of time that is specified opposite to the course in Column 2 of Part C of this Schedule; and
 - (ii) completed the course as soon as practicable after the end of that period of time.
- 6 In addition to the requirements under clause 3, the practitioner must also have completed a refresher course or the NT upskill course if, as at the vaccination date, the practitioner:
 - (a) completed a course referred to in either clause 3(a), (b) or (c) more than 3 years ago; or
 - (b) last completed a refresher course, an NT upskill course or a previously prescribed refresher course more than 3 years ago.

- 7 The practitioner must hold any one or more of the following first aid certificates, and the certificate held by the practitioner must be current as at the vaccination date:
- (a) a Basic Life Support Certificate (HLTAID010);
 - (b) a Basic Life Support Certificate (HLTAID002);
 - (c) a Provide First Aid Certificate (HLTAID011);
 - (d) a Provide First Aid Certificate (HLTAID003).
- 8 A first aid certificate mentioned in clause 7 is to be regarded as current for a period of 3 years from the date on which the certificate was issued to the practitioner.

Part A

1 In this Schedule:

NT upskill course means the 'About Giving Vaccines Upskill' course (RAHC ACRRM ID: 20369) provided by the Remote Area Health Corps.

previously prescribed course means a course that was:

- (a) previously prescribed for section 65(1A) of the Act; and
- (b) described in an instrument that is mentioned in Column 1 of Part C of this Schedule.

previously prescribed refresher course means a course that was:

- (a) previously prescribed for section 65(1A) of the Act; and
- (b) described in an instrument that is mentioned in Part D of this Schedule.

refresher course means an immunisation refresher course delivered by:

- (a) the provider of a relevant course; or
- (b) a provider accredited by Health Education Services Australia.

relevant course means a course listed in Part B of this Schedule.

vaccination date means the date on which the Schedule 4 substance that is a vaccine is to be supplied or administered by the nurse or midwife to the other person.

- 2 The nurse or midwife must be registered without conditions under the Health Practitioner Regulation National Law.
- 3 The nurse or midwife must have completed:
 - (a) an Immunisation Education Program accredited by Health Education Services Australia; or
 - (b) a relevant course; or
 - (c) a previously prescribed course that continues to be recognised in accordance with clause 5.
- 4 A nurse or midwife is to be regarded as having completed a course referred to in clause 3 if the nurse or midwife has fulfilled all of the requirements, and passed all of the assessments, for the course.
- 5 For clause 3(c), a previously prescribed course continues to be recognised as a prescribed qualification for section 65(1A) of the Act if:
 - (a) the course was undertaken or completed by the nurse or midwife within the period of time that is specified opposite the course in Column 2 of Part C of this Schedule; or
 - (b) the nurse or midwife:
 - (i) enrolled in the course within the period of time that is specified opposite to the course in Column 2 of Part C of this Schedule; and
 - (ii) completed the course as soon as practicable after the end of that period of time.
- 6 In addition to the requirements under clause 3, the nurse or midwife must also have completed a refresher course or the NT upskill course if, as at the vaccination date, the nurse or midwife:
 - (a) completed a course referred to in either clause 3(a), (b) or (c) more than 3 years ago; or

- (b) last completed a refresher course, an NT upskill course or a previously prescribed refresher course more than 3 years ago.
- 7 The nurse or midwife must hold any one or more of the following first aid certificates, and the certificate held by the nurse or midwife must be current as at the vaccination date:
- (a) a Basic Life Support Certificate (HLTAID002);
 - (b) a Basic Life Support Certificate (HLTAID010);
 - (c) a Provide First Aid Certificate (HLTAID003);
 - (d) a Provide First Aid Certificate (HLTAID011).
- 8 A first aid certificate mentioned in clause 7 is to be regarded as current for a period of 3 years from the date on which the certificate was issued to the nurse or midwife.

Liquor Act 2019

Notice of Permission for the Consumption of Liquor in City of Darwin Owned Prohibited Public Places

City of Darwin, under section 200 of the Northern Territory *Liquor Act 2019*, gives permission for the consumption of liquor by the public as specified in the following locations. Consumption is only allowed during hours stipulated, within specific locations outlined in the maps attached.

These permissions remain in place until revoked via a notice in the *Gazette*.

Nightcliff Foreshore – Lots 8694; 8657; 8695; 9353; 9647; and 9371 (as per the attached **Map 1** in Schedule 1).

Consumption is only allowed:

- Monday to Friday 5:00pm to 9:00pm; and
- 12:00pm to 10:30pm Saturday and Sunday and Public Holidays.
- A permit system is in place for consumption outside these hours for special events. Permits must be applied for in advance and can be issued by City of Darwin only. Applying for a permit does not guarantee one will be issued and permits once issued are subject to strict conditions.

Mindil Beach Park – Lot 5772 (as per the attached **Map 2** in Schedule 1).

Consumption is only allowed:

- During Mindil Beach Market nights only Thursday and Sunday - 4:00pm to 9:00pm.
- A permit system is in place for consumption outside these hours for special events. Permits must be applied for in advance and can be issued by City of Darwin only. Applying for a permit does not guarantee one will be issued and permits once issued are subject to strict conditions.

East Point Recreation Reserve – Lot 5575 (as per the attached **Map 3** in Schedule 1).

Consumption is only allowed:

- Monday to Friday 5:00pm to 9:00pm and;
- 12:00pm to 10:30pm Saturday and Sunday and Public Holidays.
- A permit system is in place for consumption outside these hours for special events. Permits must be applied for in advance and can be issued by City of Darwin only. Applying for a permit does not guarantee one will be issued and permits once issued are subject to strict conditions.

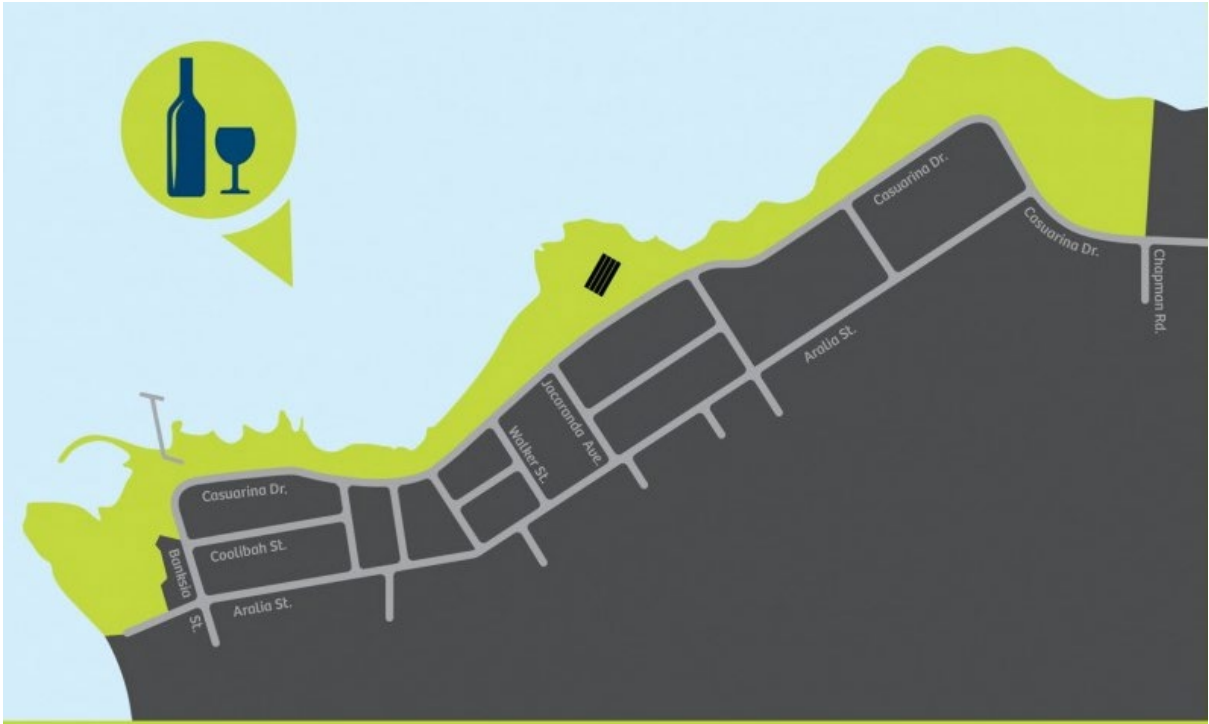
