ADOPTION OF THE PLUMBING CODE OF AUSTRALIA (VOLUME 3 OF THE NCC)

The purpose of this Building Note is to advise of the adoption of the Plumbing Code of Australia (PCA) in the Building Regulations on **3 August 2012.**

Background

On 1 May 2011 the National Construction Code (NCC) series commenced. The Building Code of Australia (BCA) is Volumes 1 and 2 of the code series, and Volume 3 is the PCA.

The Northern Territory did not adopt Volume 3 (PCA) on 1 May 2011 as further consultation with industry was necessary. Following that consultation amendments to the Building Regulations were made to adopt the PCA.

Adoption of the Plumbing Code of Australia

The PCA maintains AS/NZ 3500 as the technical standard referred to in the Deemed-to-Satisfy provisions. The difference is that the PCA permits performance based solutions (alternative solutions) and AS/NZ 3500 did not offer that flexibility.

Alternative solutions must be at least equivalent to the Deemed-to-Satisfy provisions. To ensure that such solutions meet that test, certifying engineers (hydraulic) are the only category of practitioner that may design and/or certify an alternative solution under the PCA. Other practitioners will be able to *carry out work* in accordance with alternative solutions and may continue to *design and/or certify* solutions in accordance with the *Deemed-to-Satisfy* provisions.
