NT Seniors Recognition Scheme and NT Concession Scheme

When to use this form

Use this form to verify your identity if you are an Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander Australian, who has insufficient identity documents available to claim the NT Seniors Recognition Scheme and/or the NT Concession Scheme.

Filling in this form

Use black or blue pen. Print in BLOCK LETTERS.

Complete sections 1 to 3 before giving this form to an authorised referee.

Your authorised referee will complete section 4 and return the form to you.

An authorised referee is a Northern Territory Government (NTG) employee who can verify your identity. This could be a:

- teacher
- police officer
- nurse or doctor
- housing officer
- interpreter
- person working for NTG (outside the capacity of the scheme/s).

Information for authorised referees

You must meet one of the categories listed above to be an authorised referee. This form can only be used if the person named at question 1 is an Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander Australian and is not able to provide standard identification documents.
